EPIPHANY BLESSING OF A HOME—EPIPHANY BLESSING OF YOUR HOME—You will notice that over the inside entrance to the Church we will have the Epiphany Blessing. You are invited to share the custom of dedicating your home today with the Epiphany blessing. Here is a suggested format:

+ In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Leader: God's peace be in this house and to all who live here. Magi came from the East to Bethlehem to adore the Lord; and opening their treasure chests they presented Him with precious gifts: gold for the great King, incense for the true God, and myrrh in symbol of his burial. Alleluia. *Our Father* is said.

Leader: Let us pray: O God, Who on this day revealed your only-begotten Son to all nations by the guidance of a star, grant that we who now know you by faith may finally behold you in your heavenly majesty, through Christ our Lord. Amen. Be enlightened and shine forth, O Jerusalem, for your light is come; and upon you is risen the glory of the Lord Jesus Christ, born of the Virgin Mary.

Let us pray: Lord, God almighty, bless this home, and under its shelter let there be health, charity, self-conquest, humility, goodness, mildness, obedience to your commands, and thanksgiving to God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. May your blessing remain always in this home and upon those who live here, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Sprinkle holy water throughout the home and then make the following inscription with colored chalk over the main entrance of your home: 20 + G + M + B + 10

The initials represent the first letters of the names of the Three Kings (Gaspar, Melchior and Balthasar) and the numerals represent the year 2010.
