Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

January 24, 2010 **Third Ordinary Sunday** Nehemiah 8:2-4a, 5-6, 8-10 Psalm 19 1 Corinthians 12:12-30 Luke 1:1-4; 4:14-21

The Holy Gospel according to Luke:

Since many have undertaken to compile a narrative of the events that have been fulfilled among us, just as those who were eyewitnesses from the beginning and ministers of the word have handed them down to us, I too have decided, after investigating everything accurately anew, to write it down in an orderly sequence for you, most excellent Theophilus, so that you may realize the certainty of the teachings you have received.

Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news of him spread throughout the whole region. He taught in their synagogues and was praised by all. He came to Nazareth, where he had grown up, and went according to his custom into the synagogue on the Sabbath day. He stood up to read and was handed a scroll of the prophet Isaiah. He unrolled the scroll and found the passage where it was written:

> The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord.

Rolling up the scroll, he handed it back to the attendant and sat down, and the eyes of all in the synagogue looked intently

He said to them,

"Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

Focus questions:

- 1. Describe a time when you heard good news.
- 2. Reflect on the line, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." What meaning does it hold for you?
- 3. Describe a time when you were able to reach out to the poor or the blind or someone held captive.

Family and children's question:

Today's Gospel begins with Luke addressing his reasons for writing his Gospel. How do you relate the story of Jesus to others?

Many suffer oppression, poverty, unemployment, violence, abuse neglect, degradation, loneliness, confusion, broken relationships, addiction, betrayal and disease. The year is new and we are about practicing our faith as we live our lives and die our deaths. This is Ordinary Time, the season set aside for us followers of Jesus to "drink of the one Spirit" and to be his living word, members of the body of Christ.

God's word in Scripture is powerful, but not the whole story. The story is enfleshed in Jesus.
