Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

February 7, 2010 Fifth Ordinary Sunday Isaiah 6:1-2,3-8 Psalm 138 I Corinthians 15:1-11 Luke 5:1-11

The Holy Gospel according to **Luke:**

While the crowd was pressing in on Jesus and listening to the word of God, he was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret. He saw two boats there alongside the lake;

the fishermen had disembarked and were washing their nets. Getting into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, he asked him to put out a short distance from the shore.

Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat.

After he had finished speaking, he said to Simon,

"Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch." Simon said in reply, "Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets."

When they had done this, they caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing. They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come to help them.

They came and filled both boats so that the boats were in danger of sinking.

When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at the knees of Jesus and said, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man."

For astonishment at the catch of fish they had made seized him and all those with him, and likewise James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were partners of Simon.

Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men."

When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything and followed him.

Focus questions:

- 1. Describe a time when you felt too much was being asked of you.
- 2. Relate a time when you said yes to a call from God that you did not fully understand.
- 3. What prevents you from becoming more involved in the life and work of your parish?

Family and children's question:

Jesus tells Peter not to be afraid. Talk about a time when someone encouraged you not to be afraid and their calm manner helped you overcome your fear.

OUR LITURGY TODAY—In today's Gospel we hear that Jesus himself was not respected in his hometown. This is sometimes our experience with our families, especially our children. Let us pray for all young people—for those children dear to us and for children everywhere who need guidance, confidence and hope for their future.

BLESSED CANDLES—This Tuesday, February 2 is Candlemas Day or the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. Traditionally, the blessing of candles takes place at the Mass of the Day. Those who requested Blessed Candles can pick them up at the Church Office at your convenience.

BLESSING OF THROATS—This Wednesday, February 3, is the feast day of St. Blaise. The custom of Blessing of Throats

takes place on his feast day in remembrance of Blaise. Legend has it that a mother brought her child to Blaise who was in prison. The child was choking from a fishbone lodged his throat. Blaise prayed over the child who was healed. On this day two candles are put together in the shape of an "X" and are used to bless the throats of the faithful. The reason for using candles is that it is said that while Blaise was in a dark prison a woman secretly brought him some candles for light and food for nourishment. The Blessing of Throats will take place at the 9am Mass, at 5pm, and at 7:30pm. All are encouraged to receive this sacramental.
