OUR LITURGY TODAY—We are now into five weeks of Lent, and we know how it is going. Continuing from last week on Milton. He does not know how to read or write. Like many residents of Appalachia, Milton's strong will, perseverance, and faith in God gave him the courage and strength to survive under the most impoverished circumstances. He lives in Kentucky, an astounding 30% of the residents live below the poverty level. With Milton's meager

monthly income, which is two-thirds lower than the national level, a new home is not a possibility. CAP is able to assist Milton by furnishing him with clothing and food and emergency help during the winter and transporting him to town, where health needs can be addressed. With no connection to the outside world, Milton is cut off and almost forgotten. CAP volunteers keep a close watch on Milton by visiting monthly. By visiting each person, uncovering who they are, providing the desperately needed assistance they deserve, and striving to help them make a better life, you and I, together with CAP can make a difference. What does this all mean in terms of justice and peace? They are desperate to provide Milton with better living conditions, and for the first time is willing to accept them. They are searching for an alternative for Milton. His home is so beyond repair. *To be continued*.
