BAPTISM—As soon as your child is born, please make an appointment with Dr. Joan Dorr. Preparation session and welcoming Mass attendance are required.



JUSTICE & PEACE

Continuing from last week on the challenge of the Beatitudes vs the Ten Commandments. The Ten Commandments came out of Jewish teaching. They are the law of Moses given to him by God. They are sound advice for anyone looking for moral direction. They are relatively easy to follow. Most of us find them pretty basic obligations to God, family and neighbor. A good way to describe the Decalogue, the Ten Commandments, as a baseline for moral living. If we take them literally quite a number of us might check them off and feel satisfied with ourselves. St. Paul said many times, before his acceptance of Jesus, that he kept the law perfectly. After he found Jesus he knew there was more he had to do. Jesus required more action. Paul made that metanoia. He changed completely. Another example is the story of the rich young man who tells Jesus that he has kept the law and asks Jesus what else he can do? Jesus tells him to sell everything and give to the poor and follow him. The young man walked away. Jesus asked him to go beyond and do more. We do not know if that young rich man ever came back to Jesus. What would we have done? What does this all mean in terms of justice and peace? Are we

like the rich young man and St. Paul who were very comfortable with the Ten Commandments? St. Paul made the change. The Beatitudes call us to do more. *To be continued...*
