May 9, 2010 Sixth Sunday of Easter Acts 15:1-2, 22-29 Psalm 67 Revelation 21:10-14, 22-23 John 14:23-29

The holy Gospel according to John:

Jesus said to his disciples,

"Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him.

Whoever does not love me does not keep my words; yet the word you hear is not mine but that of the Father who sent me.

"I have told you this while I am with you. The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you of all that I told you.

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid.

You heard me tell you,

'I am going away and I will come back to you.'
If you loved me, you would rejoice that I am going to
the Father; for the Father is greater than I. And now I

PARISH AWARENESS WEEKENDS—Last week and this weekend we devoted time to inform parishioners about what is going to happen when five of our loyal employees leave us after having chosen the Voluntary Separation Package offered under the auspices of the Diocese.

This weekend we will focus on the finances of the parish and how all this and more will impact on the parish. The parish will pay the cost of the separation package for the employees who are leaving up to a maximum of nine months. This will take us into March of 2011. We will be replacing the aged HVAC system of the White Room and the Red Room. The estimated cost is about \$400,000. If we include the repairs that are still needed to the various roofs of our parish complex, we add another \$100,000+ which will largely deplete the "rainy day" account that we had in the parish thanks to Msgr. Walden and his attention to finances. Our appeal this week will be for each one to take seriously what we as a parish are facing and to continue to make their sacrifices to the parish to ensure that we can meet our obligations and replenish the reserves of the parish as soon as we can. I thank the members of the Parish Pastoral Council for their

support time and effort in this challenging time in the parish's history. Our Parish Council membership is: Barbara and Joe Fratamico, John Reilly, John White, Fran Weiland, Steve Bard, Steve Gabrielli, Ann Druckenmiller, Len Munzer.

JUSTICE & PEACE

Continuing from last week on the Ten Commandments vs the Beatitudes. The Beatitudes are the heart of Jesus' teaching. They make us feel uncomfortable where as most of us are comfortable with the Ten Commandments. May we suggest a reading of Matt. 5 on the Beatitudes and Luke 6, 20-25. The versions are a little different. Matthew was writing for a Jewish

Christian group and their specific problems. Luke on the other hand was writing for a predominantly Gentile Christian audience. The messages are the same in both versions. They make us feel uncomfortable. After reading them we know we are required to do more especially those of us who have been blessed with abundance. In the sermon, blessed extols the fortunate condition of persons who are favored with blessings of God. Luke adds the woes as a reminder that in the kingdom the roles will be reversed. Matthew uses the word righteousness to mean conformity with God's law. The kingdom of God belongs to the poor in spirit, those without material wealth. What then belongs to us who have more than we need? Two or three cars, lots of food, nice homes etc.

What does this all mean in terms of justice and peace? We have to decide. The Beatitudes only make us feel uncomfortable if we are not doing God's will. How do we respond? Are we our brother's keeper? It is our responsibility to see that all people have the basics of food, clothing and shelter? *To be continued...*
