With the shocking news that one in ten Long Islanders is hungry – including over 110,000 children – as reported in the 2010 LI Harvest/LI Cares study, and with growing evidence that school lunch and summer food programs are a lifeline for hungry children, we need to support the Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010. This legislation is crucial to helping President Obama end childhood hunger in America by 2015. Child nutrition is crucial to helping President Obama end childhood hunger in America by 2015. Child nutrition programs play a vital role in helping children, especially those in low-income families, achieve access to quality nutrition, child care, and educational and enrichment activities while improving their overall health, development and school achievement.

In order to improve access to the child nutrition programs, MICAH supports the Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids

• Provide funds for grants to support the start-up and expansion of universal, in-classroom school breakfast programs in low-income schools.

• Invest in Summer Nutrition Programs by providing funding for start-up, outreach, and transportation grants. Furthermore, it must reduce the Area Eligibility Threshold from 50% to 40% for the Summer Food Service Program. This makes it easier to meet the criteria to operate these programs, thereby helping to fill the gaps in food service for millions of low-income children in New York.

Eliminate unnecessary paperwork that is a barrier to participation through data-based eligibility systems in schools in highpoverty areas and through improved direct certification systems.

Tell your Congressional Representatives to enact the Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act by sending a note written in your own hand by May 11<sup>th</sup>. Go to <u>www.house.gov</u> if you don't know the name of your representative.

#### JUSTICE & PEACE

Continuing from last week on the Ten Commandments vs the Beatitudes. The Beatitudes say that they who mourn are guaranteed the comfort of God. What are we guaranteed if we passively ignore the mourning in countries like we see going on now in Africa, Haiti and Chile? What will be our reward for turning our eyes and ears to the misery we all see about us in our own country and in our own families? We are often satisfied to keep God's cry for justice by writing out a check and continue with our daily living. Let the justice and peace committee come up with the yearly parish project. It is not easy to do. Some people in the parish could make a suggestion to the committee. If it does not cost much we will write a check. The Beatitudes suggest that it is not hard to see God. We just have to clear out our hearts to make room to see. Very often our hearts are full of good intentions but often lazy to take action. The last Beatitude promises the kingdom to those who are insulted and persecuted for the sake of Christ. Have any of us been in this situation recently or at all? Most of us would do a lot to avoid that situation. That is why we feel more comfortable with the Commandments over the Beatitudes.

What does this all mean in terms of justice and peace? The Beatitudes encourage us to raise the level of our conscience to action. It asks us to do more whereas the Commandments mostly tell us what not to do. We find the second much easier to do. *To be continued.*
