BAPTISM—As soon as your child is born, please call the Church Office to make Baptism arrangements. Preparation session and welcoming Mass attendance are required.



### The holy Gospel according to Luke:

Once when Jesus was praying in solitude, and the disciples were with him, he asked them, "Who do the crowds say that I am?" They said in reply, "John the Baptist; others, Elijah; still others, 'One of the ancient prophets has arisen." Then he said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter said in reply, "The Christ of God." He rebuked them and directed them not to tell this to anyone.

He said, "The Son of Man must suffer greatly and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed and on the third day be raised."

#### Then he said to all,

"If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will save it."

### FROM FR. MIDURA

OUR LITURGY TODAY —Today's readings focus our attention on the dynamics of repentance and forgiveness. In the first reading, Nathan proclaims God's forgiveness to King David after David repents for having Uriah killed so that he could take Bathsheba for himself. In the Gospel, Jesus proclaims God's forgiveness to the woman who bathed his feet with her tears and dried them with her hair. The psalm leads us to ask God for forgiveness, too. In the second reading, Paul reminds us that justification (which is really a matter of forgiveness) comes through faith in Christ, not by works of the law.

**NEWLY ORDAINED**—On Saturday, Bishop Murphy ordained three men to the priesthood: Fr. Henry Leuthardt, Fr. David Regan and Fr. John Ryan. Let us remember them in our prayers and pray for vocations.

#### **Full Active**

Full, active participation means entering into the movement of the liturgy itself. Liturgy wants to transform us into the image of God's Son. If we hold ourselves back, we hinder the action of God's grace within us. If we try to maintain our separation from our brothers and sisters, we resist God's efforts to form us into the one Body of Christ. If we enter into the action of the liturgy, then God can shape our minds and hearts according to the divine will. Empowered by God's grace, we who have been transformed can be used by God to transform our world. That is the ultimate goal of the liturgical renewal—to transform the world for Christ. Liturgy leads to mission and those who share in Christ's sacrificial worship are led to share in his sacrificial life and love in the world.

## **Attention at Liturgy**

We support one another's faith by the kind of response we give to the Lord in our worship. That response needs to be active, alive, and enthusiastic. We make a difference to one another by the way we are attentive to what is happening at Mass. We can build one another up by the reverence we show. Eucharistic ministers certainly notice the reverence of people as they come to receive the Lord in communion. We can also weaken one another just by our inattention, our look of boredom, our non-participation. We have an affect on one another even when we don't always know it. Our responses and actions during the liturgy are part of our ministry to one another as members of the Body of Christ.

## JUSTICE & PEACE

Continuing from last week on finding hope in a world of darkness. The most important symbol of Christianity has been the Eucharist. The word means Thanksgiving. Early Christians combined the Jewish Passover meal with Jewish Scripture. It was intended as a symbol of universal table fellowship. Remember that Jesus excluded no one. He always made room for those on the outside. The Gospel of Luke 14: 1-24 and Matthew 22:9-10 certainly make this point. It is at the table that we experience fellowship. It is in the breaking of the bread. that our humanity shows most clearly. In Judaism most rituals are celebrated not in the Synagogue or Temple but at home with the mother and father as the presider. We need to nurture our role as spiritual mothers and fathers. With the priest shortage today is God calling us to re-sanctify the home where parents preside? With the break up of families today due to divorce this is hard to do but not impossible. By our Baptism we are all "priest, prophet and king". Are we being connected to a clearly spiritual life? Rituals create families. What is needed is to rediscover the Eucharist in our family meals. I still remember my grandfather with the wine at meal time.

What does all this mean in terms of justice and peace? In the current cultural crisis it may be worth our while to hold our culture and society together by using the family as the basic building block, the natural family. *To be continued*.
