# Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

July 25, 2010 Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Genesis 18:20-32 Psalm 138 Colossians 2:12-14 Luke 11:1-13

#### The holy Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said to him,

"Lord, teach us to pray just as John taught his disciples." He said to them, "When you pray, say: Father, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread and forgive us our sins for we ourselves forgive everyone in debt to us, and do not subject us to the final test." And he said to them, "Suppose one of you has a friend to whom he goes at midnight and says, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread, for a friend of mine has arrived at my house from a journey and I have nothing to offer him,' and he says in reply from within, 'Do not bother me; the door has already been locked and my children and I are already in bed. I cannot get up to give you anything.' I tell you, if he does not get up to give the visitor the loaves because of their friendship, he will get up to give him whatever he needs because of his persistence. "And I tell you, ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks, receives; and the one who seeks, finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened. What father among you would hand his son a snake when he asks for a fish? Or hand him a scorpion when he asks for an egg? If you then, who are wicked, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?"

#### Focus questions:

- 1. Describe a time when you gave in to someone's persistence.
- 2. Relate a time when you prayed for someone or something for a very long time. What enabled you to be so persistent? What was the outcome?
- 3. What is daily bread for you?

#### Family and children's question:

Talk about the importance of prayer. This week make a special effort to pray together as a family.

OUR LITURGY TODAY — Last week in the parable of the Good Samaritan, we were challenged to an active, self-sacrificing love. In today's Gospel we are challenged to be quiet, to slow down, to listen. Together these messages encourage us to live a balanced life. Let us pray for wisdom as we seek balance in our own lives.

ST. VINCENT de PAUL INFORMATION WEEK—At all the Masses next weekend, members of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul will share information about the society to the parish. Anyone wanting to learn more about how St. Vincent de Paul works will be invited to a meeting here on July 28. We are exploring ways to augment and maintain our Parish Outreach. At the present time, our wonderful volunteers have been at Parish Outreach, Monday through Thursday, to maintain our presence to those who come to us.

**PARISH GOLF OUTING**—Our Golf Outing this year is on Monday, July 26, at the Smithtown Landing Golf Club. Cost for each golfer is \$150. There will be a buffet meal afterwards for golfers in the White Room. For non-golfers attending the dinner, cost is \$50 per person. Admission to the buffet will be by ticket only.

In conjunction with the Golf Outing, there will be a Raffle with

tickets at \$10 each or 3 for \$20. Prizes will be:

- (1) a 40" HDTV;
- (2) tickets to the musical **Billy Elliot** on August 18 at 8pm (orchestra location) with limo transportation to and from the theatre; and
- (3) Four NY Yankees baseball tickets.

There will also be a 50/50 Reverse Raffle available at \$10 a square. Winner receives \$500.

CATHOLIC MINISTRIES APPEAL 2010— Our parish's assessment this year is the same as last year's. It is \$59,020. I ask you to help the parish meet its goal so that we can all help our brothers and sisters as well as benefit from the rebate that the parish will receive once the goal is attained. We are about \$3,000 short of reaching our assessment. No pledge is too small! Whatever you can give will help us fulfill our obligation to the CMA.

If you did not receive a letter from the CMA Office, please use the cut-out in the bulletin to make a pledge. You can drop it in the collection plate in an envelope marked "CMA" and we will process it for you. We thank you for your generous support. WHAT'S HAPPENING AROUND OUR FACILITY—The contract was signed last week with the contractor to proceed with the replacement of the HVAC units in the white and red rooms. So we are good to go! Estimated cost will be in the vicinity of \$300,000 which is slightly less than we originally expected. Payments towards the project will most likely begin next month until the project is completed.

The mall between the parking lot and Kings Highway is moving towards being leveled and being seeded once the dead trees are removed. We will install a crushed concrete base to what will be a restored pathway, along which will be the Stations of the Cross that were originally there. Progress! FACILITY SCHEDULE AND HVAC WORK—During the time of demolition and retrofitting that will take place in the HVAC replacement work, we will have to schedule any funeral or other Church events during the lunch breaks of the construction workers. This will make sure that the time lines in place for the project are maintained as closely as possible to remain cost effective for us and for the contractor. We hope that anyone affected by the work will be most understanding. FEEDING THE PIGGIE—You are always invited to lend your support of the "piggie" in the Church lobby by placing any spare quarters into the tube. It goes to Heifer International which enables a family in poor areas of our country to obtain farm animals for their daily use.

HAVE YOU THOUGHT OF FAITH DIRECT? - Your ongoing support of the parish is important for us to have steady income to meet our regular bills, especially during the Summer months when so many take much needed time off. Automated giving is easy and once you set yourself up for it, it is one less step in having to remember envelopes, checks, currency, etc. It also saves paper and helps us all "go green". Give it a try. There is no obligation to continue if you find that it does not suit your needs. Pick up an application where you obtain the bulletin. If you want more information, talk to me! Thanks for your consideration.

For the month of June a total of \$8,122 was contributed to the parish through Faith Direct. \$1,598 was for Maintenance and \$6,524 for the regular weekly support. The average per week is \$1,631 above what is printed in the bulletin each week. **BEACH MASS**—We have a date of Sunday, September 12, as the date set aside for our annual Beach Mass. In the last few years, the task of organizing and making things happen has fallen on fewer and fewer people. The result is that folks who want to volunteer become reluctant because more and more work falls upon the few. We know that "many hands make for less work for everyone." We will ask for needed volunteers for the Beach Mass. Please sign up at the sign up board in the Church lobby as soon as you can. The hope is that we will know well in advance that we have the necessary people-power to make the day happen.

## **JUSTICE & PEACE**

Continuing from last week on finding hope in a world of

darkness. We left off by saying that when God is directing, instead of us, all things of change are possible because we are his servants. Today we want to continue focusing on reconstruction. When we are in the destructive mode, the word "No" comes more easily than the "Yes." Reconstruction comes with a positive vision. Deconstruction excludes people. We have said before in this column that Jesus was never into excluding or expelling people. He was only interested in transformation and integration. This is what we have to be about if we are looking for hope in a world of darkness. That is the start of reconstruction. With a positive vision and enthusiasm in its true meaning progress can be made. Jesus said it best. He used the phrase "The reign of God." Do not exclude or expel, forgive sinners. Jesus never excommunicated anyone. Only we can do that to ourselves.

What does this all mean in terms of justice and peace? Perhaps we have to, as a society, begin to include more people and use forgiveness rather than exclusion. When this begins to happen then real justice is possible. *To be continued*.
