BAPTISM—As soon as your child is born, please call the Church Office to make Baptism arrangements. Preparation session and welcoming Mass attendance are required.



The global warming trend is upon us and there are no easy solutions in sight where everyone is willing to take responsibility rather than pass the buck! Keep cool as best as you can!

WHAT'S HAPPENING AROUND OUR FACILITY—Some sprucing up of the shrubs and trees around the grounds took place this past week, as well as the cutting down of the dead trees and those that were encroaching on the utility lines in the mall area. We will clean it up as soon as possible.

The preliminary phase in the replacement of the HVAC system is in process. We do not yet have a delivery time of the units to replace the existing ones. Removal of some of the components of the old system will begin in the next few weeks. *Progress!*

It goes to Heifer International which enables a family in poor areas of our country to obtain farm animals for their daily use.

CONTINUING MINISTRY—There is an ongoing need to augment, supplement, replace (or whatever description you want to make) in the parish ministries. Eucharistic ministers, ushers, lectors, greeters, hospitality, consolation, (to mention only a few) are parish ministries that require people at all times. If you are willing and able to participate in some ministry in the parish, we would be glad to have you. OOPS! - There is a correction on the Carrot Cake recipe that was printed a few weeks ago. The ingredient that was omitted by me was the "2 cups of sugar" needed to make it right. All the rest seems to work! Sorry about that!

CARROT CAKE RECIPE

3 c. Grated carrots (about 1 lb.)

1 c. Walnuts

4 Eggs

2 cups Sugar

1 1/2 c. Oil

2 c. All-purpose Flour

2 Tsp. Baking Soda

2 Tsp. Cinnamon

1 Tsp. Salt

1/2 c. Raisins

FROSTING

8 oz. Cream Cheese

2 Tsp. Vanilla

1/4 lb. Butter (1 stick)

1 lb. Box Confectioners Sugar

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Using steel blade, grate the carrots and set aside. (Cut the carrots the same length and place snugly in feed tube using a uniform strong pressure when grating.) Using a steel blade, coarsely chop walnuts; set aside.

In a bowl, beat eggs, sugar and oil until creamy. Add flour, baking soda, cinnamon and salt; mix thoroughly. Stir in carrots, walnuts and raisins.

Grease and flour 1 tube pan or a 9 x 13 inch pan. Pour in batter and bake about 1 hour for tube pan; 35—45 minutes for 9 x 13 inch pan.

Frosting: Place cream cheese, vanilla and butter in food processor. Process with steel blade about 4 to 5 seconds. Add confectioners sugar slowly with processor running. Frost cake.
