BAPTISM—As soon as your child is born, please call the Church Office to make Baptism arrangements. Preparation session and welcoming Mass attendance are required.



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

August 15, 2010 Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Revelation 11:19a; 12:1-6a, 10ab Psalm 45 1 Corinthians 15:20-27 Luke 1:39-56

The holy Gospel according to Luke:

Mary set out and traveled to the hill country in haste to a town of Judah, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the infant leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit, cried out in a loud voice and said, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And how does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? For at the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy. Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled."

And Mary said: "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my Savior for he has looked with favor on his lowly servant.

From this day all generations will call me blessed: the Almighty has done great things for me and holy is his Name. He has mercy on those who fear him in every generation. He has shown the strength of his arm, and has scattered the proud in their conceit. He has cast down the mighty from their thrones, and has lifted up the lowly. He has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty. He has come to the help of his servant Israel for he has remembered his promise of mercy, the promise he made to our fathers, to Abraham and his children forever."

JUSTICE & PEACE

Continuing from last week on finding hope in a world of darkness. Can we see God in those who hate us and want to destroy our way of life? In light of all that has happened to us as a nation, these words are powerful but call for a response on our part. It is not easy to respond especially for those who have lost loved ones. God sent His only Son Jesus to partake of our humanity. He knew what it meant to suffer an injustice and die. Yet He asked the father to forgive those who hurt Him. Can we do less with our wounds? Jesus does not encourage or expect a world where people are never hurt or never suffer an injustice. His concern was what we do with the wound. For far too long now the world has passed on the wound from one generation to another. Jesus said for us to forgive "seventy times seven" as a medicine for healing. This response is not for a people who think they have all the answers and who also have all the appropriate punishments to retaliate for an injustice. What does this all mean in terms of justice and peace? As Christians we have been taught a different way. We have said many times in this column that Jesus was about forgiveness and inclusion of people. Are we aware that in the twentieth century we have lost more than 100 million people in wars? Aren't we tired of that yet? There has to be a better way of solving problems. Do we want to continue down the road where the world will self-destruct? Transformation can change the path. True justice and peace will then be possible. To be continued.
