BAPTISM—As soon as your child is born, please call the Church Office to make Baptism arrangements. Preparation session and welcoming Mass attendance are required.



# Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

September 19, 2010 Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time Amos 8:4-7 Psalm 113 1 Timothy 2:1-8 Luke 16:1-13

#### The holy Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus said to his disciples, "A rich man had a steward who was reported to him for squandering his property. He summoned him and said, 'What is this I hear about you? Prepare a full account of your stewardship, because you can no longer be my steward.' The steward said to himself, 'What shall I do, now that my master is taking the position of steward away from me? I am not strong enough to dig and I am ashamed to beg. I know what I shall do so that, when I am removed from the stewardship, they may welcome me into their homes.' He called in his master's debtors one by one. To the first he said, 'How much do you owe my master?' He replied, 'One hundred measures of olive oil.' He said to him, 'Here is your promissory note. Sit down and quickly write one for fifty.' Then to another the steward said, 'And you, how much do you owe?' He replied, 'One hundred kors of wheat.' The steward said to him, 'Here is your promissory note; write one for eighty.' And the master commended that dishonest steward for acting prudently. "For the children of this world are more prudent in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light. I tell you, make friends for yourselves with dishonest wealth, so that when it fails, you will be welcomed into eternal dwellings. The person who is trustworthy in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones; and the person who is dishonest in very small matters is also dishonest in great ones.

If, therefore, you are not trustworthy with dishonest wealth, who will trust you with true wealth? If you are not trustworthy with what belongs to another, who will give you what is yours? No servant can serve two masters. He will either hate one and love the other, or be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and mammon."

PILGRIMAGE TO LOURDES—This past week I took part in a Pilgrimage to the Marian Shrine in Lourdes, France. Originally, there was supposed to be a pilgrimage to Lourdes this past June involving the priests of our diocese to celebrate the Year of the Priesthood. Unfortunately, not enough priests were able to go and the trip was cancelled. A priest colleague of mine expressed a deep desire to go anyway, so we attached ourselves to a tour that was for September 3-10. We had to contend with Hurricane Earl in the Atlantic which caused havoc with air travel on the East Coast that Friday. We finally did leave JFK and rocked our way across the Atlantic to Paris and then on to Pau airport in southern France and the Shrine at Lourdes.

It was a beautiful experience to be with Pilgrims from all over the world and to experience a place where our Blessed Mother appeared. With the candlelight processions and the Marian devotions during the day and visits to other holy places, the story is that you can never fully describe it unless you go for yourself.
