BAPTISM—As soon as your child is born, please call the Church Office to make Baptism arrangements. Preparation session and welcoming Mass attendance are required.



OUR LITURGY TODAY — Today's Gospel message is challenging. It is Jesus warning his disciples—and us—not to ignore the needy. Jesus is very clear, very specific. Let us ask God today for the courage to listen to the Gospel and for the grace to heed it.

Starting time is 2pm. The gathering is a peaceful demonstration on behalf of all those who have been affected by the evil of abortion and on behalf of the dignity of the human person from conception to natural death.
