The holy Gospel according to Luke:

JUSTICE & PEACE

If we were asked the question as to whether we are social sinners, most of us would probably say "No." In fact most of us *are* social sinners but we may not realize that we sin socially every day. For example, when we purchase a product do we question who made the product and did that person receive a fair wage? Most of us are probably more interested in the price. Do we question if child labor was used to make the product? We could go on with very many products we use and purchase every day that are produced and made by people who work long hours under harsh conditions and receive little compensation so that we may enjoy a better life. Some simple examples like

having a banana or a cup of coffee, the very clothes we wear may have been made by children. Yet most of us would say we are not social sinners.

What does this all mean in terms of justice and peace? There is a curious dis-connect between people's views and the church's on social issues of politics and social morality from the standpoint of faith. Social teaching has been a part of the teaching of the church for over 100 years. The popes and bishops have written on social justice. Why then do we not hear more from the pulpit? The priest is ready but are we willing to hear what he has to say. Yes we understand that times are hard for a lot of people today but something can be done to correct the injustice many people go through to produce the products we use every day.

Justice is a parish affair.
