BAPTISM—As soon as your child is born, please call the Church Office to make Baptism arrangements. Preparation session and welcoming Mass attendance are required.



This is a dimension of preaching the Gospel. What does all mean in terms of justice and peace? The task of evangelization is that the Christian understanding of salvation possess social and political dimensions. It is our responsibility as disciples of Jesus to critique the unjust structures of society that oppresses people. We are to observe, judge and act. To do less would make us a part of social sin.
