BAPTISM—As soon as your child is born, please call the Church Office to make Baptism arrangements. Preparation session and welcoming Mass attendance are required.



JUSTICE & PEACE

We left off talking about Paul VI. In his writings he said that as Christians it was our responsibility to critique the unjust structures of society that oppresse people. Today we take a look at the writings of John Paul II. In reflecting on Vatican II he noted that in the world of his time we were seeing an increase of hunger, oppression, injustice, war, sufferings, terrorism, and other forms of violence. Nothing has changed. In fact it is much worse today under Pope Benedict XVI. The pope is trying hard to make people see the futility of constant wars. In a change from Paul VI, John Paul II spoke of sinfulness of the human heart as the root cause of social injustice. John Paul II often used the term "culture of death." He was highlighting the negative features of the word. Pope Benedict XVI is saying that love, properly understood, is our road to life. What does this all mean in terms of justice and peace? Every week we attend Mass. Do we understand that the liturgy forms the assembly into a just and peaceable community sent forth into the world to be faithful disciples in transforming the world into a more just society. To do this we have to live the Gospel. There is a connection between one's Catholic faith and civic obligation.

Justice is a parish affair.

Discover needs and act justly.
