BAPTISM—As soon as your child is born, please call the Church Office to make Baptism arrangements. Preparation session and welcoming Mass attendance are required.



# Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

December 5, 2010 Second Sunday of Advent Isaiah 11:1-10 Psalm 72 Romans 15:4-9 Matthew 3:1-12

#### The holy Gospel according to Matthew:

John the Baptist appeared, preaching in the desert of Judea and saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" It was of him that the prophet Isaiah had spoken when he said: A voice of one crying out in the desert, Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths.

John wore clothing made of camel's hair and had a leather belt around his waist. His food was locusts and wild honey. At that time Jerusalem, all Judea, and the whole region around the Jordan were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the Jordan River as they acknowledged their sins.

When he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to his baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath? Produce good fruit as evidence of your repentance. And do not presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.' For I tell you, God can raise up children to Abraham from these stones. Even now the ax lies at the root of the trees. Therefore every tree that does not bear good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire.

I am baptizing you with water, for repentance, but the one who is coming after me is mightier than I. I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fan is in his hand. He will clear his threshing floor and gather his wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

- 1. Advent is a time for deeper conversion and growing in our relationship to God and others. What are you doing this Advent to enter in to its spirit?
- 2. Who has been like John the Baptist in your life pointing you in the direction of God?
- 3. Describe a time when you took your faith for granted. Who or what made you aware of what you were doing?

### JUSTICE & PEACE

Today is our last column on Catholic Social Teaching for a while. We will come back to it again in the future. We want to end with Pope Benedict XVI. In a recent article, the Pope quoted Luke 16:19-31 where Jesus tells the parable of the rich man and the poor man named Lazarus. The first one lives in luxury and self concern, and when he dies, ends up in Hell. But the poor man, who ate the scraps from the rich man's table, is carried by the angels to the eternal dwelling of God and the saints. "Blessed are you poor, "the Lord proclaimed to His disciples, "because yours is the kingdom of God" (Luke 6-20). What does all mean in terms of justice and peace? The message is very clear. It points out that while we are in this world we must listen to the Lord and live according to his will. After death it will be too late to make up what we failed to do when alive. Jesus loves the poor and lifts them up from humiliation. Our own destiny is conditioned by our attitude. It is up to us to follow the road of life that God has shown us and this is the road of love, not understood as sentiment but as service to others in the charity of Christ Some of the wording comes directly from the Pope.

Justice is a parish affair. Discover needs and act justly. Together we can make a difference.
