BAPTISM—As soon as your child is born, please call the Church Office to make Baptism arrangements. Preparation session and welcoming Mass attendance are required.



December 19, 2010 Fourth Sunday of Advent Isaiah 7:10-14 Psalm 24 Romans 1:1-7 Matthew 1:18-24

The holy Gospel according to Matthew:

This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about. When his mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found with child through the Holy Spirit.

Joseph her husband, since he was a righteous man, yet unwilling to expose her to shame, decided to divorce her quietly.

Such was his intention when, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her. She will bear a son and you are to name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet:

Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel, which means "God is with us." When Joseph awoke, he did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took his wife into his home.

There has to be a better way of solving the problem of unemployment. We will see how things change when the new government takes office. We hope and pray that things will be better.

Justice is a parish affair. Discover needs and act justly. Together we can make a difference. Dec. 13 is St. Lucy.
