BAPTISM—As soon as your child is born, please call the Church Office to make Baptism arrangements. Preparation session and welcoming Mass attendance are required.



# Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

January 2, 2011 The Epiphany of the Lord Isaiah 60:1-6 Psalm 72 Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6 Matthew 2:1-12

#### The holy Gospel according to Matthew:

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage."

When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born.

They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet:

And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel."

Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search diligently for the child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage."

After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way.

- 2) Describe a time when you searched for something that was of value to you. How did you react when you found it?

WHAT'S HAPPENING AROUND OUR FACILITY—The border carpet in Walden Hall was replaced this past week. It got "tired" looking and Walden Hall needed to be refreshed. *Progress!*

**REVERENCE AT COMMUNION TIME**—As we, the Faithful, approach to receive the Body and Blood of Christ, we are asked to bow our heads before saying "Amen" and receiving the Eucharist under the form of Bread or Wine. The rules of Fasting require us to refrain from eating anything for one hour before receiving Communion. This applies to gum chewing as well.

TUNE UP AND AN OIL CHANGE—This past week I had to go to St. Francis Hospital to deal with ongoing cardiac issues. The end result was another cardiac catherization and the insertion of a stent to deal with a cardiac blood vessel that was 95% occluded. So we now have eight stents after nine catherizations and two bypass surgeries that did not take.

#### BISHOP MURPHY'S CHRISTMAS MESSAGE

Dear Beloved Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

This year my Christmas Greetings to you will be brief but no less heartfelt. The Angels who raised the joyous hymn that first Christmas night can be heard again this Christmas in the hearts of us all. "Glory to God in the Highest" echoes in our hearts and lives because we all are thankful that God so loved the world that He sent His only Son. He so respected us, created in His own image, that He wanted "one like us in all things but sin" to become our redeemer.

"One like us" is truly that because, like us, He is born of a human mother. Mary, like all mothers, carried her beloved Son in her womb from the day the Angel Gabriel announced to her God's plan of salvation to the moment in that Bethlehem stable when she, the perpetual Virgin Mother, gave birth to Him Who is the light of all humankind.

This is the gracious and wondrous gift who comes to dwell in our hearts as surely as He dwelt in her womb and as surely as He lived his days on earth. He is "God with us". He knows us and we know Him if only we open our hearts to Him as the Magi opened their gifts to honor Him.

The best way we honor Him is to do what He calls us to do: celebrate the Eucharist, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. My full Christmas message to you can be found in my Advent/ Christmas Pastoral Letter, **Belong More Deeply**. You can find it in your parish Church, as an insert in parish bulletins, in *The Long Island Catholic* and on our diocesan website, <a href="https://www.drvc.org">www.drvc.org</a>. Telecare is another source where it can be found.

Please read it at your leisure. I wrote it after the priests of our

Diocese urged me to do so. They shared their thoughts which helped shape my words. I did so with eager longing for the implementation of the new Roman Missal which will begin on the First Sunday of Advent next year. I did so because I believe this coming year will offer us many opportunities to deepen our personal and ecclesial ties to the Lord and to one another. No place and no moment is more precious in bringing all this about than when we gather in our Churches to celebrate Sunday Mass. My deepest Christmas wish for all of us is that this Christmas we discover how deep is the love God has given us through His Son and how much He calls us to belong more deeply in Him and the Church through the Mass where Jesus is born and re-born every time we gather to proclaim our faith in the Lord Who calls us to be one with Him.

Lord, bless all who look upon this manger; may it remind us of the humble birth of Jesus, and raise up our thoughts to him, who God-with-us and Savior of all, and who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.

May Christ our God enlighten our hearts and minds, now and forever. Amen.

(The Manger may be sprinkled with Holy Water).

**BLESSING OF A CHRISTMAS TREE**—The following may be used as a prayer for our Christmas Tree:

+Let us glorify Christ our light, who brings salvation and peace into our midst, now and forever. Amen.

Amidst signs and wonders, Christ Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea. His birth brings joy to our hearts and enlightenment to our minds. Wit this tree, decorated and adorned, may we welcome Christ among us. May its lights guide us to the perfect light.

Let us Pray. Holy Lord, we come with joy to celebrate the birth of your Son, who rescued us from the darkness of sin by making the cross a tree of lie and light. May this tree, arrayed in splendor, remind is of the life-giving cross of Christ, that we may always rejoice in the new life that shines in our hearts. We

ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.
