LONG ISLAND CATHOLIC—Our diocesan Catholic newspaper is a vital tool for teaching and evangelizing the faith, and also for providing us with news about the Church from Rockville Centre to Rome. If you wish to have a Mass folder, the cost is \$5 additional. *REVERENCE AT COMMUNION TIME*—As we, the Faithful, approach to receive the Body and Blood of Christ, we are asked to bow our heads before saying "Amen" and receiving the Eucharist under the form of Bread or Wine. The rules of Fasting require us to refrain from eating anything for one hour before receiving Communion. This applies to gum chewing as well.

EPIPHANY BLESSING OF YOUR HOME—You will notice that over the inside entrance to the Church we have the inscription of the Epiphany Blessing. You are invited to share the custom of dedicating your home today with the Epiphany blessing. Do the following:

Make the Sign of the Cross on yourself.

Leader: God's peace be in this house and to all who live here. Magi came from the East to Bethlehem to adore the Lord; and opening their treasure chests they presented Him with precious gifts: gold for the great King, incense for the true God, and myrrh in symbol of his burial. Alleluia.

Our Father is said.

Leader: Let us pray: O God, Who on this day revealed your only-begotten Son to all nations by the guidance of a star, grant that we who now know you by faith may finally behold you in your heavenly majesty, through Christ our Lord. Amen. Be enlightened and shine forth, O Jerusalem, for your light is come; and upon you is risen the glory of the Lord Jesus Christ, born of the Virgin Mary.

Let us pray: Lord, God almighty, bless this home, and under its shelter let there be health, charity, self-conquest, humility, goodness, mildness, obedience to your commands, and thanksgiving to God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. May your blessing remain always in this home and upon those who live here, through Christ our Lord. Amen. Sprinkle holy water throughout the home and then make the following inscription with colored chalk over the main

JUSTICE & PEACE

We left off by saying if we can imagine a better more peaceful world then true justice and peace is possible.

Francis of Assisi was very much like most of us today. He was searching for meaning and beauty in a world that no longer made sense to him. Think about those who have lost their jobs and homes today. Much of what they see makes no sense to them today. Many may never recover what they have lost. Francis took the teachings of Jesus literally. He lived the Gospel message. Francis was a peacemaker at home and abroad. Francis was a rebuilder. He said "we cannot change the world in so far as we can change ourselves". We must learn to be an answer. Only the forgiven can forgive. Only the healed can heal. Only those who stand daily in need of mercy can offer mercy to others.

Remember Jesus and Francis had no agenda for social reform. They moved outside the system. They did not fight it. They did it better That is what we have to do today. Until we allow the Gospel to move into our deepest level and touch our worldview nothing very much is going to change. Either we acknowledge that God is in all things or we have lost the ability to see God in anything. St Francis was able to see God in a worm. Most of what

Jesus taught had to do with forgiveness. We pray for the grace to let go of grudges and those hurts we hold onto. When we can do this true justice and peace is possible and we are free. What does all this mean in terms of justice and peace? Either we begin to change at how we see life and change ourselves first or do we just continue as usual toward destruction. We hope you have enjoyed this series and it has been enlightening to you. Much of the information came from a book by Father Richard

Rohr "Hope against Darkness".
