BAPTISM—As soon as your child is born, please call the Church Office to make Baptism arrangements. Preparation session and welcoming Mass attendance are required.



*OUR LITURGY OF SUNDAY*—Jesus, the Lamb of God, is the light of the nations who came to do the Father's will. In Christ we have been called to be a holy people.

**END OF THE CHRISTMAS SEASON**—Today's feast of the Baptism of the Lord officially ends the Christmas season and the resumption of Ordinary Time.

## JUSTICE & PEACE

The diocese asked us to do a series on Racism on Long Island in 2005. Today we are taking a look at what we said then and see if things have changed. January is a good time to start since it is the month we remember and celebrate the work of Martin Luther King to eliminate racism. We were asked then to examine our conscience on racism that divides our Long Island community. Racism is alive and well on the island. We still have segrated communities. Some schools are overwhelming black. In fact due to the unemployment more Black people are hurting more than before. Some may remember Farmingville

and the hostility towards Latino immigrants at the time. Suffolk County executive Steve Levy came up with a plan to deputize County police officers as federal immigration agents. These officers would be able to detain suspects who lacked documentation and begin deportation proceedings This caused a shockwave throughout the whole Latino community. This was cancelled soon after he proposed it. Things are worse for Latinos today due to unemployment. Many of us have fought a good fight to overcome violence and injustice, people like Gandhi, Rosa Parks, Martin Luther King, Cesar Chavez, Dorothy Day and millions of other non-violent drum major's for justice and peace. What does this all mean in terms of justice and peace? Many of the problems that were with us in 2005 are still here today 2011. The government is trying hard to close the border with Mexico where a lot of people are still coming to the USA. The problems are worse today due to the unemployment issue and will probably continue until the economy gets better.

Justice is a parish affair.

Discover needs and act justly.

Together we can make a difference.




