# FROM FR. MIDURA

**OUR LITURGY FOR SUNDAY**—Today we hear two familiar scripture passages: the Genesis story of the first sin of Adam and Eve; and Matthew's account of Jesus going out into the desert, where the Evil One tries to tempt him to sin. Let us ask to be mindful of our sins and pray for the grace of repentance. **LENTEN NOTES**—

### 1. LENT

Lent runs until the Mass of the Lord's Supper exclusive, the beginning of the Sacred Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday).

### 2. FAST AND ABSTINENCE

All Catholics who have reached their 14th year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day.

**3. OPERATION RICE BOWL**—One of the ways we can think about our brothers and sisters in need is through Operation Rice Bowl. Under the auspices of Catholic Relief Services, all

monies received from our Lenten Rice Bowls go towards meeting the needs of the poor and the hungry in our world, here and abroad. You can obtain your "Rice Bowl" where you get the bulletin and you can return it at the end of Lent or any time. Simply give it to one of the ushers.

**4. SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION**—You are welcome to join our Religious Ed Levels as they celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. It will be on Saturdays beginning at 11am and 3:30pm on March 5, 12, &19. *LENTEN RETREAT*—We will have our parish Lenten Retreat on six Wednesday nights of Lent. They will be March

16, 23, 30 and April 6, 13 & 20. Time will be 7:30pm in the Church. Presenters will be: Patricia Leonard and James Philips. The topics in successive weeks will be:

# JUSTICE & PEACE

We are now in the first week of Lent. It is a period of time that calls us to "turn" our spirits and souls away from whatever steals our time and energy away from the things of God buried in the depths of our hearts. Lent calls us to the never-completed work of conversion—the everyday struggle to turn toward the life of God. This prayer might help us on our journey through Lent.

"Turn us, O God, this Lent away from our exhausted, dark winter state of mind and re-turn us to the light and warmth of your compassion and forgiveness."

To many Catholics, devotions have various levels of prayer potency. Which prayers are the most effective? That depends on the person praying. When we pray, it is more about having a conversation with God that comes from the heart, letting it reflect on our personal relationship with Jesus. When we say personal prayers there is something you have to think about, so we usually get more out of it. There is no personal rule book. What we owe ourselves is to be aware of the depth and breadth that is Catholic spirituality and devotion. When we know this we usually find something that fits us. God has allowed us to see that He is with us. God wants us to understand that He is in our life right now.

What does this all mean in terms of justice and peace? Lent is the time to put our lives in order. It is a time to reflect on how we are living our life. Do we share our blessings with the poor? Lent is the time to change what needs to be changed and understand that God loves us very much and desires to welcome us to our eternal home. The choice is ours.

Please remember our Lenten Project for the Sisters. They are doing fine work to help the poor. *To be continued*.
