FEAST WEEKEND 2011—Our annual feast weekend will take place this year on Saturday and Sunday, June 11-12. On Saturday night in Walden Hall, following the 5pm Mass, we will have a "Texas BBQ and Square Dance" featuring three choices of entrees: Slow Smoked Pulled Pork or Roasted 1/2 Chicken or Prime Rib. All come with sides, beverages and dessert. Cost is \$45 per person. Tickets will be available after weekend Masses until then.

On Sunday, we will have our traditional Pancake Breakfast after the 8am, 9:15am and 10:45am Mass.

LENTEN NOTES—

1. LENT

Lent runs until the Mass of the Lord's Supper exclusive, the beginning of the Sacred Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday).

2. FAST AND ABSTINENCE

All Catholics who have reached their 14th year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day.

3. OPERATION RICE BOWL—Under the auspices of Catholic Relief Services, all monies received from our Lenten Rice Bowls go towards meeting the needs of the poor and the hungry in our world, here and abroad. After the Lenten season bring your Rice Bowls to the Church and give them to me or to one of the ushers.

4. SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION—The

Sacrament of Reconciliation is available on Saturdays from 4pm to 4:45pm. There will be a Reconciliation Day on Monday of Holy Week throughout the Dioceses of Rockville Centre, Brooklyn and New York. That means all parishes in these three dioceses will be asked to provide opportunities for

the Sacrament from 3pm to 9pm.

JUSTICE & PEACE

Today is the fifth Sunday of Lent. How do we find joy in Lent?

One way is to start with God's love. When Jesus was baptized the heavens opened up, the Spirit descends in the form of a dove and the love of God is poured out on Jesus with the words: "You are my beloved Son. In you I am well pleased." Then Jesus went into the desert. We can follow this pattern and find joy and new life in our Lenten desert. Our good deeds will not convince God to save us. God's love and God's free gift of salvation will. God is already loving and saving us. God is not someone manipulated by us. God loves first and unconditionally. In response we should joyfully enter into prayer, fasting and almsgiving in order to thank God and His overflowing love for us. What does this all mean in terms of justice and peace? We can deceive ourselves by focusing on our own virtues. A better approach is simply to open up to God's loving embrace as Jesus did at his baptism. Remember the parable Jesus taught about the two men who went to the temple to pray. The Pharisee and the tax collector. The Pharisee was so proud of what he had done. The tax collector beat his breast saying "Oh God, be merciful to me a sinner." The tax collector went home justified not the Pharisee. To be continued.

Justice is a parish affair.

Together we can make a difference.
