Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

May 1, 2011 Second Sunday of Easter or Divine Mercy Sunday Acts 2:42-47 Psalm 118:2-4, 13-15, 22-24 1 Peter 1:3-9 John 20:19-31

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John:

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." Now. Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNIONS—For the next two weeks, we will celebrate First Holy Communions at the 5pm Saturday Mass and at the 9:15am and 12:15pm Sunday Masses.

OUR LENTEN PROJECT FOR THE SISTERS —As our parish Lenten project, we asked everyone's support of the Franciscan Sisters of the Renewal by donating to the "little house" at the display in the Church Lobby. LITURGICAL CHANGES—Some of you may have heard that there will be some changes in the way we pray at Mass. The theology and what we believe in will not change, but some of the language will change, reflecting a closer connection to the original Latin language that we used in our Liturgy before the vernacular entered in. So, we will begin using space in the bulletin to explain what is happening as well as to print the changes we can expect to experience the First Sunday of Advent.

ADULTS WHO ARE SEEKING CONFIRMATION—Any adult who is interested in seeking to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation is asked to call the Church Office and leave their name and phone number. Prep classes will begin after Easter in anticipation of celebrating the Sacrament on Pentecost Sunday which is June 12. Just a reminder that to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation, a Catholic must have received the Sacrament of Confirmation.

BISHOP MURPHY'S EASTER LETTER

Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Risen Christ:

"O Happy Fault, O Necessary Sin of Adam that has gained for us so great a Redeemer". To one and all I send my prayers and best wishes for a happy and joyous Easter. Many years ago, one of my friends answered the every day question "what's new?" by saying "Jesus Christ is Risen!" He is right because that is true. This is the only news that is always good and always new!

The holy season of Lent has brought us step by step with Jesus closer and closer to His freely accepted destined goal: Death on a Cross. As He made His way to Jerusalem, He encountered the Samaritan woman at the well and offered her "living water". Giving sight to the man born blind, He asked him, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?" for He is the one Who gave that blessed man sight and brings us from the darknesses that had haunted our own hearts into His own marvelous light. He is the one Whose loving heart called out to His friend four days in the tomb, "Lazarus, come forth" and so restored life to one who was dead, thus foreshadowing the moment when He, glorified, would come forth from the tomb, defeating sin and death forever. GETTING READY FOR THE NEW ROMAN MISSAL

(Over the coming month's we will publish information pertaining to the Roman Missal that will become effective with the First Sunday of Advent).

Explaining the History of the Roman Missal

The Roman Missal is the book containing the prescribed prayers, chants, and instructions for the celebration of Mass in the Roman Catholic Church. Published first in Latin under the title *Missale Romanum*, the text is then translated and, once approved by a *recognitio* by the Vatican Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, is published in modern languages for use in local churches throughout the world. In 2002, Pope John Paul II introduced a new edition of the *Missale Romanum* (*editio typica tertia*, the "third typical edition" [since the Second Vatican Council]) for use in the Church. Soon after, the complex work of translating the text into English began. As the Church in the United States and throughout the English-speaking world prepares to introduce the new edition of the Missal, so does the Church in other countries as the *Missale Romanum*, *editio typica tertia* is translated into other languages. The process of implementing a new edition of the prayers of the Mass is not new, but has occurred numerous times throughout the history of the Church as the Liturgy developed and was adapted to particular circumstances to meet the needs of the Church.
