May 22, 2011 Fifth Sunday of Easter Acts 6:1-7 Psalm 33: 1-2, 4-5, 18-19 1 Peter 2:4-9 John 14:1-12

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

Jesus said to his disciples: "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me. In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If there were not, would I have told you that I am going to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back again and take you to myself, so that where I am you also may be. Where I am going you know the way."

WHAT'S HAPPENING AROUND OUR FACILITY—All the HVAC units were given a Spring cleaning in readiness for the cooling season. The last week or so was a challenge in that the units had to vacillate from heat to cooling in a short span of time. So, one could feel hot and then feel cold in the time that it took to celebrate Mass together.

We have to meet with a firm that has been hired by the diocese to walk through all the buildings of St. Thomas More to assess what needs to be done to keep them in working condition (as if we did not already know what needs to be done!)

We have to tend to the cleanup of some of the areas of the Church where folks felt that it was better to grind in their gum droppings into the carpet and on the under side of the pews rather than place it behind their ears when they came into Church for Communions. Too bad we could not trace the DNA and mail the gum back to the owner !*Progress!*

FAITH DIRECT—Using Faith Direct has had a positive effect on the parish's finances. Each week the average support to the parish is close to \$2,000 with Maintenance and Repair support about \$500 per week. It is an easy way to make parish support on a consistent basis. For those who are gradually going "green and paperless" it is an electronic breeze! Even this author has had to accept change that sometimes is tough. Have you ever gone to one of the banks where a deposit no longer requires a deposit slip? You give your checks and cash to the machine and it does all the work for you! Consider using Faith Direct. There are application forms available where you go the bulletin.

As of last month, there were 86 participants in Faith Direct. Two members chose to drop out last month. A full accounting is printed with the weekly support section.

JUSTICE & PEACE

We continue from last week on Catholic social teaching and Pope John XIII. The encyclical writings of the Pope are important to understand what is going on today. He tried to read the signs of the times and his writings were adopted by Vatican II. These simple words signaled a basic change of the character of (CST). For example, for the first time, there was a change in the natural law concept. It was up to that point, the thought that the difference between peoples and nations was, in part, due to fear and faulty reasoning. Now the emphasis was more attuned that not all human beings possessed the faculty for reasoning that leads to moral conclusions. There was a new emphasis on the return to the word of God. The Vatican Council taught that the inner meaning of humility was revealed by Christ in his relationship to the Father and the mystery of the Trinity reveals man to man himself. This focused on relating the Gospel rather than applying social doctrine to contemporary issues. There was now a new understanding that we are not only in the image of God but also in the light of Jesus Christ. These were great changes. What does all this mean in terms of justice and peace? This generates a powerful sense of worth of each person. The Christian moral life is not simply directed by the right reason but also by drawing on the Divine Law, to confirm conclusions drawn from natural law reasoning. This now puts the ball game in our court. Are we ready to take the responsibility? We shall see. To be continued.

GETTING READY FOR THE NEW ROMAN MISSAL

(Over the coming month's we will publish information pertaining to the Roman Missal that will become effective with the First Sunday of Advent).

EMBRACING CHANGE IN THE LITURGY

Some of the words used in the new translation of the Mass may be unfamiliar to some Catholics.

The following list of definitions may help to increase your understanding of the rich theology that underlies these texts. **Abasement:** The lowering of one of higher rank. Jesus abased himself in that, though he was God, he lowered

himself and became a human being so that he might save us from our sins (see Phil 2:6-11).

Adoption: In Baptism, the Holy Spirit transforms us into children of the Father, thereby making us his adopted sons and daughters in the likeness of his eternal Son (see Eph 1:3-6). In this way, the faithful are made "partakers in the divine nature (cf. 2 Pt 1:4) by uniting them in a living union with the only Son, the Savior" (Catechism of the Catholic Church [CCC], no. 1129). In the sacraments, we become the sons and daughters of God by adoption through Christ Jesus.

Angels and archangels, cherubim and seraphim,

thrones and dominions: Spiritual, personal, and immortal creatures, with intelligence and free will, who glorify God and serve him as messengers of his saving plan. Traditionally, the choirs of angels have been divided into various ranks, including archangels, cherubim, seraphim, thrones, dominions, principalities, and powers (see Col 1:16).

Chalice: From the Latin word "calix" meaning "cup" (see Ps 116:13; Mt 20:22; 1 Cor 10:16). The use of this term in the Liturgy points to the chalice's function as a particular kind of cup and indicates the uniqueness of what it contains, the very Blood of Christ.
