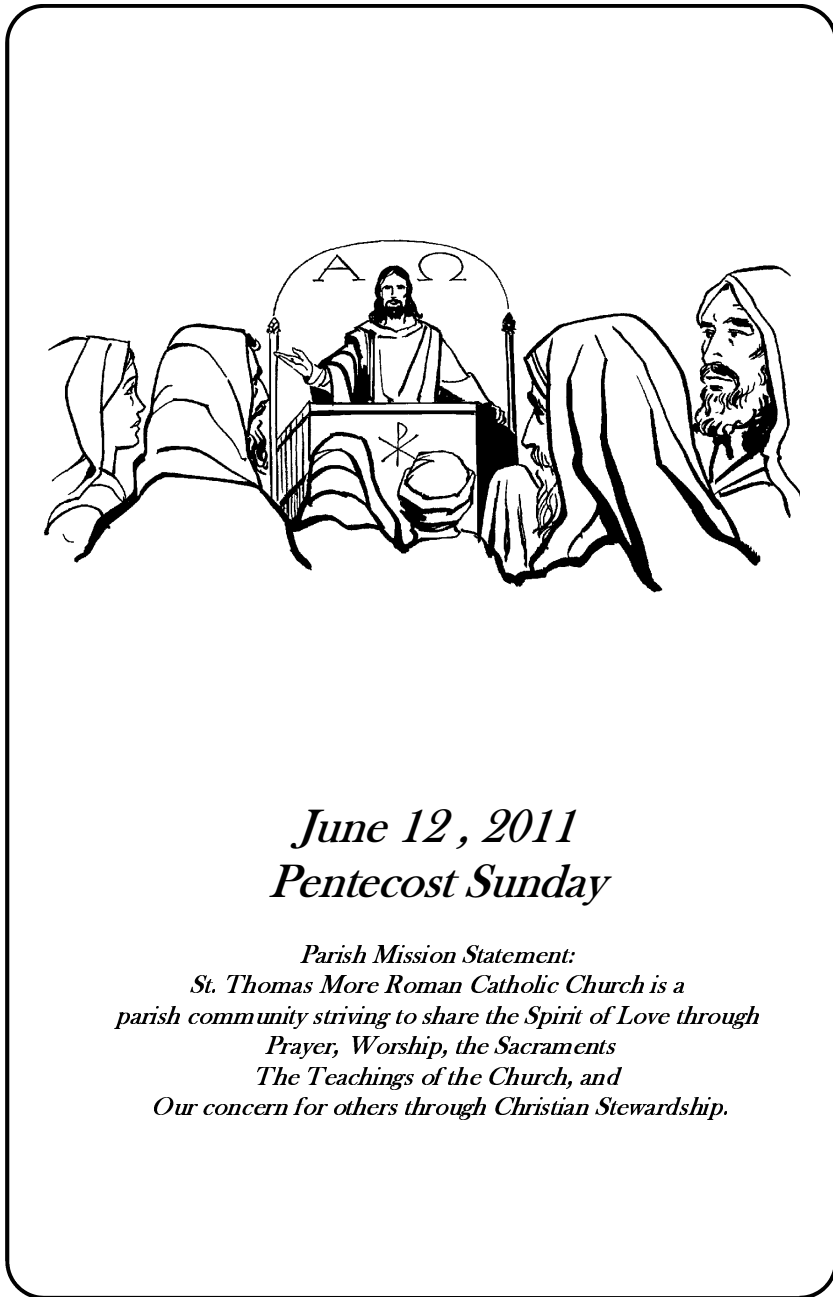

JUSTICE & PEACE

Continuing from last week on Catholic social teaching. We left off by saying that modern Catholic social teaching is constantly evolving based on conditions around the world. When global food shortages began to be more and more evident and the population growing we saw the slogan "Eat simply so that others may simply eat," As Christian consumers are we interested in where and who produces the food we eat? Are we interested in the conditions of labor and if the wages are just? What are the working and living conditions of the workers? When we buy food do we take into account what CST and our faith asks us to do based on our understanding of the facts? What would you do? If we knew the whole story of what we just said perhaps our thoughts and consumption of food would change. Are we aware that fresh produce travels more than 1000 miles before it reaches our table? Now answer the question from above and compound this with the price of oil today. Our food costs will surely go up, but what about the workers who grow and work hard to produce our food? Most of us have the ability to pay more but very often we have to take away from other things just to buy food. What about the millions who are now starving and/or are forced to eat less and less. What does this all mean in terms of justice and peace? CST and our faith asks us to be informed on issues and then respond.

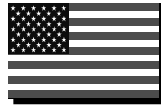

DRESS IN CHURCH
