Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

June 26, 2011
The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ
Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16a
Psalms 147:12-13, 14-15, 19-20
1 Corinthians 10:16-17
John 6:51-58

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

Jesus said to the Jewish crowds: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." The Jews quarreled among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him. Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven. Unlike your ancestors who ate and still died, whoever eats this bread will live forever."

FROM FR. MIDURA

OUR LITURGY FOR SUNDAY—Jesus came among us to show us the face of God and to reveal the divine nature—a nature that is mysteriously both One Person and a Community of Persons. And so, created in that divine image, we are somehow called to be both an individual and unavoidably part of a community. Today, we are that community. Let us pray for the grace to reveal the face of God.

FEAST OF ST. THOMAS MORE—This Wednesday, June 22, is the feast of our parish patron, St. Thomas More. Sir Thomas More, also known by Catholics as Saint Thomas More, was an English lawyer, social philosopher, author, statesman and noted Renaissance humanist. He was an important counselor to King Henry VIII of England and for three years towards the end of his life he was Lord Chancellor. He is recognized as a Saint within the Catholic Church and is commemorated by the Church of England as a

'Reformation martyr'. He was an opponent of the Protestant Reformation and in particular of Martin Luther and William Tyndale.

Thomas More coined the word "utopia" - a name he gave to the ideal, imaginary island nation whose political system he described in *Utopia*, published in 1516. He opposed the king's separation from the Catholic Church and refused to accept the king as Supreme Head of the Church of England, a status the king had been given by a compliant parliament through the Act of Supremacy of 1534. He was imprisoned in the Tower of London in 1534 for his refusal to take the oath required by the First Succession Act, because the act disparaged the power of the Pope and Henry's marriage to Catherine of Aragon. In 1535 he was tried for treason and beheaded.

More was beatified by the Catholic Church in 1886 and canonized, with John Fisher, in 1935. In 1980, he was added to the Church of England's list of 'saints and heroes of the Christian Church'.

Continuing from last week on catholic social reaching. We left off with food production and the ability to purchase food. We have heard the saying, that hunger is one problem we can solve. Are we aware that the global food supply is, for the most part, controlled by a few transnational corporations such as Philip Morris, Archer Daniels Midland, Con Agra and General Mills? These corporations own or have influenced the entire food chain. They control the farm land, the farm finance, seeds, equipment, fertilizers, pesticides, grain collection, milling, livestock production and slaughtering, just to mention a few. We can see by this that these few corporations control most of the food produced. All this is, for the most part, bad news. The profit for small family owned farms is very thin. Their profits are small while the large corporation's profits grow richer. The toll on the poor of the world is even greater. Due to price supports these corporations can undersell the farmers in the poorer nations. This may sound good but are we aware that 60% or more of the populations in those countries make a living from the land? What does this all mean in terms of justice and peace? What we have said causes more unrest and poverty in the poorer nations. Hungry people cannot buy the food they need to survive. CST and our faith calls us to take action. To be completed next week.

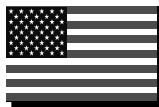
