OUR LITURGY FOR SUNDAY—Today we hear another parable of the kingdom. In this parable of the wheat and the weeds, Jesus tells us that we must be patient as God is patient, and leave to God the condemnation of the "weeds" - that is, those who do evil. JUSTICE & PEACE

Continuing from last week on faithful citizenship. The Catholic approach to faithful citizenship begins with moral principles. The direction to this can be found in Scripture and Catholic Social teaching. For the sake of clarity let us review these points.

- 1. Life and dignity of the human person.
- 2. Call to family and participation.
- 3. Rights and responsibilities
- 4. Option for the poor and vulnerable.
- 5. Dignity of work and rights of workers.
- 6. Solidarity.
- 7. Caring for God's creation.

In number 1, we believe that every life is important from conception to natural death. People are more important than things. The measure of every institution is how it protects the life, the dignity of the human person.

In number 2, marriage and family are the basic unit of social life. It should be supported and strengthed not undermined. In number 3, every person has a fundamental right to live a decent life, to food, shelter, education, employment, health care and housing.

In number 4, a fundamental measure of our society is how we care for the poor and vulnerable. We are called to make the option for the poor part of our lives.

In number 5, the rights of workers and owners must be exercised to promote the common good. This includes productive work, fair wages, ownership of public and private property and the right to join a union.

In number 6, we are one human family. We are called to be peacemakers. Pope Paul VI said "if you want peace work for iustice".

In number 7, we are called to be stewards of God's creation not only for ourselves but for future generations. How do we care for God's creation?

What does this all mean in terms of justice and peace? How are we doing on these 7 statements? Not very well in today's time. The divorce rate is very high. Many people are out of work. Many have lost homes. Many have lost hospital and medical coverage. The list goes on and on. Many people are hurting bad. I am sure that many of you reading this can well agree. To be continued.
