BAPTISM—As soon as your child is born, please call the Church Office to make Baptism arrangements. Preparation session and welcoming Mass attendance are required.



August 21, 2011 Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time Isaiah 22:19-23 Psalm 138:1-2, 2-3, 6, 8 Romans 11:33-36 Matthew 16:13-20

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

Jesus went into the region of Caesarea Philippi and he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" They replied, "Some say John the Baptist, others Elijah, still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets." He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter said in reply, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

Jesus said to him in reply, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah. For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father. And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." Then he strictly ordered his disciples to tell no one that he was the Christ.

FROM FR. MIDURA

OUR LITURGY FOR SUNDAY—It is natural to call some people family or friends and others strangers. But Jesus challenges our idea of who belongs and who is an outsider. Over and over again in the Gospel, we are given examples of the holy foreigner who becomes a disciple of Jesus. Let us pray today in thanksgiving for all those holy foreigners who enrich our faith and for those Jesus is calling us to know and love today.

THE FEAST OF THE ASSUMPTION OF MARY—The Assumption of Mary is an official dogma of the Vatican affirming that the mother of Jesus never actually experienced physical death, and instead entered into Heaven in bodily form accompanied by a host of angels. Roman Catholics believe that Mary was transported into Heaven with her body and soul united. The feast day recognizing Mary's passage into Heaven is celebrated as *The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary* by Roman Catholics. This doctrine was defined by Pope Pius XII on November 1, 1950, in his Apostolic Constitution, *Munificentissimus Deus*. In those denominations that observe it, the Assumption is commonly celebrated on August 15.

Although the doctrine of the Assumption of Mary may somewhat controversially tend to honor and glorify her more than Jesus because of its assertion that she never experienced physical death, while Jesus actually did, and although it may also cast a question about the nature of physical resurrection, it gives a useful perspective on the uninterrupted continuity of the physical dimension of life beyond earthly life.

Usually the Assumption is a Holy Day of Obligation for all Catholics to observe by attending Mass, since the day falls on a Monday, it is not observed this year as a Day of Obligation. All are still encouraged to celebrate the day by attending the 9am Mass.

PARISH BEACH MASS—The date for the Parish Beach Mass is Sunday, September 18, at Schubert Beach, beginning with Mass at Noon on the beach. All are invited to attend. The high tide is after 3pm that day, so we do not have to worry about water encroaching our gathering.

In order to make it happen, we need people to volunteer to help from coordination, to set up, to service, to take down, to storing. If you can help, please let us know by using the sign up sheets at the bulletin board in the Church Lobby. Last year many more came forth to help make it happen and we can do the same thing this year. Mark the date on your calendars! We need to know who is coming. Please return the reservation form in the bulletin by September 12. Please include a \$5 deposit for each person attending. When you arrive at the park, you will get your entire deposit back.

MUMS—We will have mums in various colors available for purchase to beautify your homes. You should have received the order form in the mail or you can use the one printed in this bulletin. Cost will be \$5 per plant. You can also order decorative Kale or Cabbage in this year's order. So we can order the correct amount of each plant, please return your orders by August 28. They will be available for pick up beginning the first weekend of September. We will also have a limited number of mums available during that weekend on a first come, first served basis.

GETTING READY FOR THE NEW ROMAN MISSAL

(Over the coming month's we will publish information pertaining to the Roman Missal that will become effective with the First Sunday of Advent).

What difference will these changes make?

Some of the differences will be obvious immediately. We will have to learn new musical settings for the various parts of the Mass. We will learn new words for common prayers, such as the Creed. Those of us who began saying the Mass prayers by heart long ago will need to rely on printed texts again, at least for a while. In the early months of the transition, we may find it more challenging to pray with one voice as people adjust to the new texts and gradually commit them to their hearts.

But these surface differences will give way to deeper and more significant changes. If we use the time of preparation well, we will make the changes with a deeper understanding of the Liturgy and a renewed reverence for and appreciation of the Mass. We will hear the prayers with new ears and with new hearts. Our Liturgy will be filled with new life and new spirit as we celebrate the Paschal Mystery of Christ made present for us.

How can I prepare for the change?

There are many ways in which you can prepare for the changes in the Mass:

□ Make a conscious effort to participate more fully in the Mass each Sunday and holy day.

□ Visit the *Roman Missal* Web site (*www.usccb.org/ romanmissal*) to study the new texts and to learn more about the changes.

 \Box Read the new texts of the people's parts at Mass. Begin to study them so that you will be able to pray them well when the new *Roman Missal* is implemented.

 $\hfill\square$ Pray for a renewal of love for the Liturgy in your parish and in the Church.
