BAPTISM—As soon as your child is born, please call the Church Office to make Baptism arrangements. Preparation session and welcoming Mass attendance are required.



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

September 18, 2011 Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time Isaiah 55:6-9 Psalm 145:2-3, 8-9, 17-18 Philippians 1: 20c-24, 27a Matthew 20:1-16a

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

Jesus told his disciples this parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out at dawn to hire laborers for his vineyard. After agreeing with them for the usual daily wage, he sent them into his vineyard. Going out about nine o'clock, the landowner saw others standing idle in the marketplace, and he said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard, and I will give you what is just.' So they went off. And he went out again around noon, and around three o'clock, and did likewise. Going out about five o'clock, the landowner found others standing around, and said to them, 'Why do you stand here idle all day?' They answered, 'Because no one has hired us.' He said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard.' When it was evening the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, 'Summon the laborers and give them their pay, beginning with the last and ending with the first.' When those who had started about five o'clock came, each received the usual daily wage. So when the first came, they thought that they would receive more, but each of them also got the usual wage. And on receiving it they grumbled against the landowner, saying, 'These last ones worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us, who bore the day's burden and the heat.' He said to one of them in reply, 'My friend, I am not cheating you. Did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? Take what is yours and go. What if I wish to give this last one the same as you? Or am I not free to do as I wish with my own money? Are you envious because I am generous?' Thus, the last will be first, and the first will be last."

1. Relate a time when someone was surprised by your generosity.

2. Describe a time when someone else thought you received better treatment than you deserved.

3. Describe a time when you were grateful that God was more generous than you would have been.

FROM FR. MIDURA

OUR LITURGY FOR SUNDAY—Today's Gospel can be one of the most difficult teachings of Jesus to apply to our lives. It is the command to forgive others as we are forgiven by God. It may be a particularly challenging message today as we observe the 10th anniversary of 9/11. Let us pray that we are ready to hear God's message; to do what Jesus would do; to do what Jesus asks of us.


