BAPTISM—As soon as your child is born, please call the Church Office to make Baptism arrangements. Preparation session and welcoming Mass attendance are required.



OUR LITURGY FOR SUNDAY—In today's Gospel Jesus makes the complex simple, reducing many laws to only two: Love God and love your neighbor. Simple, yes, but not easy. And so we come together to pray for what we need to keep these two commandments.

JUSTICE & PEACE

Continuing from last week. We left off by saying that great changes will be made when we read the Gospel through the eyes of the poor in the Third World. Today we focus on feelings. We all have feelings. We have feelings about people, nations, governments, issues and a host of subjects that cross our mind each day. Unless we learn to let go of our feelings, we don't have feelings, the feelings have us. We should not deny or suppress our feelings. The challenge is to name them, identify them, and watch them. Don't fight or identify with them. What does this all mean in terms of justice and peace? We can't convert ourselves; we get converted from within. This is where prayer comes into play especially contemplative prayer. In that form of prayer where we sit in silence and let God speak to us we begin, as St. Francis developed in his spirituality, to be reformed from within. We learn to let go of our feelings and get out of the way, God can then speak to us. We learn to be quieter, smaller, and less filled with our own self and its flurry of ideas and feelings. When we bring our emotions and feelings to God as an act of powerlessness, we begin to see the Gospel from the eyes of the poor and powerless. Great changes are now possible. St. Padre Pio said " Pray with perseverance, trust, and a serene and calm mind. Pray, hope and don't worry. Worry is useless. God is merciful and will hear your prayer, Prayer is the best weapon we have; it is the key that opens God's heart ." To be continued.
