Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

November 20, 2011 Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King Ezekiel 34:11-12, 15-17 Psalm: 23:1-2, 2-3, 5-6 1 Corinthians 15:20-26, 28 Matthew 25:31-46

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

Jesus said to his disciples: "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit upon his glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before him. And he will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will place the sheep on his right and the goats on his left. Then the king will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me.' Then the righteous will answer him and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? When did we see you ill or in prison, and visit you?' And the king will say to them in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me.' Then he will say to those on his left, 'Depart from me, you accursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me no drink, a stranger and you gave me no welcome, naked and you gave me no clothing, ill and in prison, and you did not care for me.' Then they will answer and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or ill or in prison, and not minister to your needs?' He will answer them, 'Amen, I say to you, what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for me.' And these will go off to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life."

- 1) Describe a time when you encountered Christ in another person.
- 2) Relate an experience when someone reached out to you when you were hungry, thirsty or in need of comfort.
- 3) How do you respond to the physical needs of Christ's poor?

JUSTICE & PEACE

Continuing from last week. We left off by saying that the Gospel has to be read through the eyes of the poor. We are a product of Western civilization. Their focus was on power, the complete opposite of what Jesus proclaimed. Their faith came from the head whereas the poor developed a faith from the heart. Good theology is important but spirituality is above everything else. It was the priests and theologians who killed Jesus. The ones who accepted Him were the lepers. the poor, the prostitutes, the powerless, and the disenfranchised. Truth isn't where we suppose it to be. In Matthew 19:30 Jesus says, "Be prepared for the surprise that the first will be last and the last will be first." What does all this mean in terms of justice and peace? Spirituality goes hand in hand with social justice. It is not easy to

integrate spirituality and commitment to social justice issues. We have to learn to let go of some preconceived notions. Good example are the base communities of Central and South America. They are having an effect on their governments. When people are on a serious inner journey to their own powerlessness and are in contact with the powerless men and women of the world, then community will result and great things will be accomplished in terms of justice and peace.
