Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

January 8, 2012
The Epiphany Of The Lord
Isaiah 60:1-6
Psalm 72:1-2, 7-8, 10-11, 12-13
Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6
Matthew 2:1-12

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, He inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet:

And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel."

Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search diligently for the Child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage." After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way.

Focus Questions:

- 1. Who or what event was the star that led you to a better understanding of Jesus?
- 2. As Catholics we are called to make Jesus known to others, how do you deal with the Herods of the world who wish the opposite?
- 3. Who has guided you to seek Jesus in a deeper way? How can you be a guide for others?

Family and children's question:

Describe an experience when you felt Jesus' presence during this Christmas season.

The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord will be celebrated on Monday, January 9. The liturgical season of Christmas ends on January 9 and Ordinary Time in our Church begins on Tuesday, January 10.

FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY—This remembrance of the visit of the Three Kings will be next Sunday. Among certain nationalities, the Feast of the Epiphany is a time to celebrate the Epiphany Blessing of homes. You may have noticed that over the inside entrance of the Church are written in chalk "20+G+M+B+11" which are the initials to the Three Kings, Gaspar, Melchior and Balthasar surrounded by the current year 2011. We will renew this Epiphany blessing for the current

year of 2012.

The Epiphany blessing that you can use for your own homes is the following:

EPIPHANY BLESSING OF YOUR HOME—

Make the Sign of the Cross on yourself.

Leader: God's peace be in this house and to all who live here. Magi came from the East to Bethlehem to adore the Lord; and opening their treasure chests they presented Him with precious gifts: gold for the great King, incense for the true God, and myrrh in symbol of his burial. Alleluia.

Our Father is said.

Leader: Let us pray: O God, Who on this day revealed your only-begotten Son to all nations by the guidance of a star, grant that we who now know you by faith may finally behold you in your heavenly majesty, through Christ our Lord. Amen. Be enlightened and shine forth, O Jerusalem, for your light is come; and upon you is risen the glory of the Lord Jesus Christ, born of the Virgin Mary.

Let us pray: Lord, God almighty, bless this home, and under its shelter let there be health, charity, self-conquest, humility, goodness, mildness, obedience to your commands, and thanks giving to God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. May your blessing remain always in this home and upon those who live here, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Sprinkle holy water throughout the home and then make the following inscription with colored chalk over the main entrance of your home: 20 + G + M + B + 12
