Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

January 15, 2012 Second Sunday in Ordinary Time 1 Samuel 3:3b-10, 19 Psalm 40:2, 4, 7-8, 8-9, 10 1 Corinthians 6:13c-15a, 17-20 John 1:35-42

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

John was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi" - which translated means Teacher -, "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come, and you will see." So they went and saw where Jesus was staying, and they stayed with him that day. It was about four in the afternoon. Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus. He first found his own brother Simon and told him, "We have found the Messiah" - which is translated Christ -. Then he brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, "You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas" - which is translated Peter.

- 2) Who in your life has been a companion on your journey of faith?
- 3) Looking back over this last week where have you encountered Jesus?

FROM FR. MIDURA

OUR LITURGY FOR SUNDAY—Today we celebrate the Epiphany of our Lord — that day when those strangers from the East, the three wise men, presented their gifts to the infant Savior; the day we acknowledge that Jesus came for all people and dwells in the hearts of people in all lands. FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY—This remembrance of the visit of the Three Kings is this Sunday. Among certain nationalities, the Feast of the Epiphany is a time to celebrate the Epiphany Blessing of homes. You may have noticed that over the inside entrance of the Church are written in chalk: "20+G+M+B+11" which are the initials to the names of the Three Kings, Gaspar, Melchior and Balthasar surrounded by the current year 2011. We will renew this Epiphany blessing for the current year of 2012.

The Epiphany blessing that you can use for your own homes is the following:

EPIPHANY BLESSING OF YOUR HOME—

Make the Sign of the Cross on yourself.

Leader: God's peace be in this house and to all who live here. Magi came from the East to Bethlehem to adore the Lord; and opening their treasure chests they presented Him with precious gifts: gold for the great King, incense for the true God, and myrrh in symbol of his burial. Alleluia. Our Father is said.

Leader: Let us pray: O God, Who on this day revealed your only-begotten Son to all nations by the guidance of a star, grant that we who now know you by faith may finally behold you in your heavenly majesty, through Christ our

Lord. Amen.

Be enlightened and shine forth, O Jerusalem, for your light is come; and upon you is risen the glory of the Lord Jesus Christ, born of the Virgin Mary.

Let us pray: Lord, God almighty, bless this home, and under its shelter let there be health, charity, self-conquest, humility, goodness, mildness, obedience to your commands, and thanksgiving to God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. May your blessing remain always in this home and upon those who live here, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Sprinkle holy water throughout the home and then make the following inscription with colored chalk over the main entrance of your home: 20+G+M+B+12

Refer to the list you recently received in the mail or ask for a listing of scrip cards where you obtain Supermarket Scrip cards. Usually an order that is placed by Monday is received by the end of the same week. The cards cost you face value. There are no premiums added on to the value of the card. They are as good as cash.


