BAPTISM—As soon as your child is born, please call the Church Office to make Baptism arrangements. Preparation session and welcoming Mass attendance are required.



#### A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark:

In their synagogue was a man with an unclean spirit; he cried out, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are., the Holy One of God!" Justice is a parish affair. Discover needs and act justly. Together we can make a difference.




