Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

February 5, 2012 Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time Job 7:1-4, 6-7 Psalm 147: 1-2, 3-4, 5-6 1 Corinthians 9:16-19, 22-23 Mark 1:29-39

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark:

On leaving the synagogue Jesus entered the house of Simon and Andrew with James and John. Simon's mother-in-law lay sick with a fever. They immediately told him about her. He approached, grasped her hand, and helped her up. Then the fever left her and she waited on them.

When it was evening, after sunset, they brought to him all who were ill or possessed by demons. The whole town was gathered at the door. He cured many who were sick with various diseases, and he drove out many demons, not permitting them to speak because they knew him.

Rising very early before dawn, he left and went off to a deserted place, where he prayed. Simon and those who were with him pursued him and on finding him said, "Everyone is looking for you." He told them, "Let us go on to the nearby villages that I may preach there also. For this purpose have I come." So he went into their synagogues, preaching and driving out demons throughout the whole of Galilee.

Focus Questions:

1. In the midst of the busyness of life, how do you find time to pray?

2. Relate a time when you felt a crowd of demands on you. What helped you to stay grounded?

3. Describe a time when you were cured of an illness.

Family and children's question:

Talk about the importance of prayer in your life. Make a decision to pray at the same time each day. At the end of the week talk about what that experience was like.

3) **The Church in Africa** – the funds will go to assisting African countries where poverty, sickness and political strife prevent people from living in dignity.

Usually an order that is placed by Monday is received by the end of the same week. The cards cost you face value. There are no premiums added on to the value of the card. They are as good as cash.
