On Sunday, June 17, we will have a Pancake Breakfast after the 8am, 9:15am and 10:45am Masses. There will be a nominal donation of \$2 per person.

BLOOD DRIVE—We will have a Blood Drive on Thursday, May 24, in Walden Hall. Sign up is at the Blood Drive table located in the Lobby. An adequate blood supply is necessary to meet daily needs. Only we can help by making a donation. If you donate regularly, we thank you for signing up. If you have never donated, consider doing so.

FISHING TRIP—All aboard! Our Parish Fishing Trip will be on Tuesday, June 19, aboard the Dixie II, out of Captree Boat Basin. Cost is still \$45 per person. Please fill out the cut out in

the bulletin and return it with your payment.

GOLF OUTING—The date of our Parish Golf Outing this year is Monday, July 23, at the Smithtown Landing Golf Course.

WHAT'S HAPPENING AROUND OUR FACILITY—We grass seeded the bare areas of the lawns and added more seed to the mall area. We further assessed the condition of the roofs of the original Church building to find that they will need immediate attention or we will face potential and significant leaks. So, most likely we will have to resurface these roofs right after the Feast weekend. We did not anticipate this additional expense for the current year, but it has to be done. Anticipated cost is about \$120,000. What Progress!

OPERATION RICE BOWL—Please return your donations to Operation Rice Bowl by giving the Rice Bowl to one of the ushers, to myself, or drop it off at the Church Office.

MASS INTENTIONS FOR 2013—The 2013 Mass Book is available for reserving Masses for those who have died and also for the intentions of those who are living. When you come to arrange Masses, please have your choices and intention names written down in case the Office is busy. This way we can arrange the Masses for you. The diocesan standard stipend for Masses, beginning in 2013, will be \$20 for a single Mass intention and \$15 for a Mass with multiple intentions. There are dates for this year 2012 that are also available.

REVERENCE WHEN RECEIVING THE EUCHARIST—We are asked to make a head bow as we approach to receive the Body of Christ and the Blood of Christ. Then we respond: "Amen" when we are presented with the Body of Christ or the Blood of Christ.

The host is to be consumed immediately after receiving it. It is not to be carried away nor is it to be consumed part at a time. If you see anyone who has not consumed the host, please ask them to kindly do so or alert one of the deacons or priests.

CATHOLIC MINISTRIES APPEAL 2012—St. Thomas More has a goal or assessment this year of \$60,700. Please help us meet this year's goal by making a pledge. There is no amount too small or insignificant. Every little bit helps. Use the form that is in today's bulletin.

CENSUS UPDATE—Every household on our mailing list recently received a census update form in the mail. Please complete and return the form to the Church office or place it in the collection basket. Sometimes individuals have moved out to

be on their own and no longer live in our parish. Some get new cell phone numbers. Some change professions and embark on a profession, etc., etc.

What we ask every household to do is to supply us with some basic information to keep us up to date as best as we can. *AMERICAN FLAGS*—As you might notice, the American flag is flown 24/7 at our flag pole. We replace the flag every three or four months, depending on how the weather has affected the flag. If you have a new flag that you do not use and would like to present it to the parish to be used until it needs to be replaced, please see me and we would be happy to use it and mention in whose memory and honor the flag is being flown. *USED AMERICAN FLAGS*—If you have an American flag that is no longer useable, you can bring it to the Church and we will present it to the American Legion on your behalf for proper disposal.

THE FIRST COMMUNION EXPERIENCE—The staff and the coordinators worked very hard to prepare our young people for the celebration of First Communion. We ask adults responsible for these children to take part in various activities with their children as they journey towards First Communion. Most participate willingly. Some, unfortunately, look upon the invitation to be active in the spiritual formation to be a thorn in their side. Whatever the case might be, we at the parish attempt to make the day a beautiful day, whether it rains or does not rain.

Our challenge is when we have to deal with those who come as guests of the children to the Church. Their behavior has become more and more of a total lack of regard and total lack of respect for the House of the Lord. Short of bringing a Big Mac along with them, we find water bottles under the pews and varied other wrappers from gum, candy and other food items that the guests have left behind. The used gum is pressed under the pews. Cell phone use and text messaging indicate a poor comprehension of the English language when a sign states that no cell phones are to be used.

The noise generated from loud conversations enhances the lack of respect and regard to the point where attempts to sing by the congregation is almost drowned out by the talking. The celebrant had to stop during one of the Masses because he could not hear himself over the loud talking. The guests were even oblivious to this pause as they were not even in tune to what was going on and kept talking until those around them told them to stop talking.

At the subsequent First Communion rehearsals, the adults with the children were asked to consider not inviting guests to the Church who were not Churchgoers or who were known to be individuals who would disrupt the atmosphere of prayer and solemnity of the First Communion celebration.

It should not be a day when parishioners openly avoid First Communion celebrations because of the negative experiences they have that are generated by those whose interests are solely theirs and no one else's.

To remind a person of etiquette is countered by the comment from them that the staff or celebrant are having a bad day is a weak attempt to justify their own shallowness of Faith and to promote their attitude that the world owes me and that everyone around me owes me. We have to pray for these folks and hope that one day they realize there is a bigger world out there besides their world.
