BAPTISM—As soon as your child is born, please call the Church Office to make Baptism arrangements. Preparation session and welcoming Mass attendance are required.



May 27, 2012 Pentecost Sunday Acts 2:1-11 Psalm 104:1, 24, 29-30, 31, 34 1 Corinthians 12-3b-7, 12-13 John 20:19-23

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit

and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim.

At this sound, they gathered in a large crowd, but they were confused because each one heard them speaking in his own language. They were astounded, and in amazement they asked, "Are not all these people who are speaking Galileans? Then how does each of us hear them in his native language? Continuing from last week on finding hope in a world of darkness. We are all wounded but what is important is what we do with the wound. After a wound and the long dark night of the journey, there is something we know after having passed

through. The suffering and the wound has taught us something and now we are different. We have said that a Metanoia occurs after a suffering and leads to that turn around to a new direction. We all get a turn at the wheel of life. Sometimes we are on the upside and other times on the downside. What is important is what are we learning in each cycle. When Jesus was talking to the rich young man (Mark 10:20), the problem with that man was that he never wanted his turn at the wheel.

He was never transformed and remained small in many ways. He could not empathize with the poor and suffering. What does

this all mean in terms of justice and peace? Can we empathize with the poor?

For example look at our record as a Church towards slavery, sexuality, sexism, racism etc.

Today the Church has had a Metanoia on many of these issues and they have become part of Catholic teaching. Can we as individuals do this? Can we learn from our wounds? Can we transform and be transformed? *To be continued*.

Justice is a parish affair. Discover needs and act justly. Together we can make a difference. The 21st is Saint Christopher Magallanes and companions.
