BAPTISM—As soon as your child is born, please call the Church Office to make Baptism arrangements. Preparation session and welcoming Mass attendance are required.



A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark:

Jesus said to the crowds: "This is how it is with the kingdom of God; it is as if a man were to scatter seed on the land and would sleep and rise night and day and through it all the seed would sprout and grow, he knows not how. Of its own accord the land yields fruit, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the grain is ripe, he wields the sickle at once, for the harvest has come."

He said, "To what shall we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable can we use for it? It is like a mustard seed that, when it is sown in the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on the earth.

But once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade." With many such parables he spoke the word to them as they were able to understand it. Without parables he did not speak to them, but to his own disciples he explained everything in private.

Focus Questions:

- 1) How have you benefited from seed planted by others?
- 2) Describe a time when you felt everything depended on you. Who helped you realize that that isn't the whole story?
- 3) The apostles needed additional teaching because they were slow to understand what Jesus was teaching. Describe a time when you were slow to understand something about your faith. Who helped you to see?

Family and Children's Question:

Talk about the things that are working but are hidden from view, like seeds growing into plants. How do you see God at work in the world in a way that is not always visible?

JUSTICE & PEACE

Continuing from last week on finding hope in a world of darkness. We left off by asking: "are we willing to change and grow?" Today we want to focus on spiritual awakening. If we wish to find hope in a world of darkness, then we have to begin to transform ourselves and then, step by step, the world. This calls for a spiritual awakening. This is what we have been saying in this column, a metanoia, a fundamental change and transformation. This usually occurs with personal suffering or a great deal of awareness. Sometimes it happens like Saint Paul being knocked off a horse. When this happens, we begin to know three things at a deeper level: God is good, the world is good, and we are good. This is the start of transformation. We begin to move from the "I" self to the "God self". The ability to self-criticize and to begin to own the dark side of the self is a sign of health and growth.

What does this all mean in terms of justice and peace?. When we are transformed, we begin to create structures and

institutions that think differently and therefore act differently when this real change occurs and when justice and peace begin to be a reality in society. To be continued.


