

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Friends,

On Monday afternoon the 24th of September, 2012, Bishop Murphy called me and said that I am appointed as pastor of St. Thomas More, Hauppauge...believe me I took 2 days to learn the correct spelling for 'Hauppauge'...(wait, let me check if I correctly spelled it).

At the end of July, Msgr. Francis Midura who served at the altar of God and in the community of St. Thomas More had been called by his Creator to enter the Glory of Resurrection to be ever at the banquet of the Kingdom of God. Eternal Light shine upon him and may his soul rest in peace. He will be missed very much by all of us. His spirit of service and care will be kept alive in the everlasting memory of the parish family of St. Thomas More.

When I accepted Bishop Murphy's assignment to come as pastor to St. Thomas More, I knew that I had to learn everything from scratch...even to the spelling of Hauppauge. When I visited the parish and skimmed through the responsibilities I quickly realized that I have big shoes to fill. But our trust is in the God of abundance, who can take the little of five loaves and two fishes and multiply them to feed five thousand and more of His People. When I accepted to serve as your pastor, I am surrendering my 5 loaves and 2 fishes at the hand of the Lord to be multiplied at the service of St. Thomas More.

Now a brief note on me: I am a priest for 30 years, ordained on May 2, 1982, for the Diocese of Coimbatore, India. I served two years as an associate pastor in St. Michael's Cathedral, Coimbatore, India. In 1984, I was sent to Rome to do Biblical Studies in the Pontifical Institute, Biblicum. After my graduation as 'Licentiatus in Re Biblica', I returned to India in 1988, and taught Scripture in the Good Shepherd Interdiocesan

Major Seminary for seven years.

In 1995, the Diocese of Rockville Centre was kind enough to give me a position of Chaplain in Mercy Medical Center, Rockville Centre, which in turn helped me pay the tuition to do Doctor of Ministry in New York Theological Seminary, Manhattan, NY.

When I graduated as Doctor of Ministry in 1999, my bishop in India asked me to be the diocesan representative to promote the diocesan programs here in the U.S. To make the long story short, events led one to another and in 2010, my bishop in India was gracious enough to let me be excardinated from my Indian Diocese of Coimbatore and Bishop Murphy was gracious to welcome me to be incardinated into our beautiful Diocese of Rockville Centre.

Now, after serving 11 years as associate pastor in St. Raphael's Church God sends me to you, the parish family of St. Thomas More, to walk and work with you, to grow and to be enriched in Grace together, to love and live in God's gift always. God's call does not happen in a vacuum. God's call becomes a historical reality for me in YOU, the parish family of St. Thomas More. Life is made fully alive and meaningful when God's purpose is lived. You are my God's purpose to be lived in St. Thomas More.

October 11, 2012, our Mother Church declared open the Year of Faith. This weekend's Gospel proclaims that 'All things are possible with God.' (Mk 10:27) Let us together begin the journey of Faith in God with whom everything is possible. To repeat the beautiful words of St. Augustine, 'For you I am Pastor but with you I am a fellow Catholic.' I am happy to walk and work with you, to guide and grow with you.
