BAPTISM—As soon as your child is born, please call the Parish Office to make Baptism arrangements. Preparation session and welcoming Mass attendance are required.



FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends:

Hurricane Sandy devastated homes and crumbled our lives. Full power has not yet been restored. Gas is becoming a rare commodity day by day. Businesses are suffering. Everyday commute to work is costlier and burdensome. On and on we can list the sufferings we undergo.

The other side of Sandy is that, people in spite of their suffering, try to reach out to less fortunate family members and neighbors. Every day we hear so many good Samaritan stories of people going out of their way to help those in need. Families welcome families who have no electric power to provide warm shelter, to share food, to facilitate hot showers, etc.

As much as we suffer, the sufferings have opened our hearts to extend our hands of help towards others. Power failure has surrounded us with darkness but inner eyes are opened to see those facilities of life we have taken for granted. Without electricity we are helpless and our lifestyle is paralyzed. But this situation has offered more time to speak and stay with our friends and family members. It has forced us to be away from being glued to the TV or other electronic devices and brought us to be with each other.

We have no control over nature and its forces. We can at the most predict to a certain extent how they would affect us. In no way can we prevent them or escape them. But we have always the choice of how we can react to any disaster that nature hits

It can touch our outer properties but cannot change our inner potentialities. Our inner force can always bring a new meaning to our suffering and create a lively future even with the less we have. Sandy has taken away some of what we have while it has also opened a new depth of what we are for each other in love, compassion, fraternal service etc.

I appreciate your generous offering that you made last Sunday in the second collection. You were so generous at such short notice. Thanks a million. Let us pray that this tough time may come to an end soon; that we come back to normal situations speedily. Let us try our best to reach out to the others who are still suffering and in need of help. Let us also pray for all those who work day and night to restore public services. Let us also take a personal moment for ourselves to appreciate those things that we take for granted. Let us pray for each other's patience and endurance.

Jesus put all the commandments into two. CST started with Jesus and continues down through today with the Pope and Bishops. With all the injustice in the world we have been slow to understand and live the commandments. These commandments are fixed and unchangeable. Respecting the dignity of the human person is the cornerstone of CST.


