RECONCILIATION—Celebrated in Church every Saturday from 4pm to 4:45pm, or by previous appointment with Parish Office.

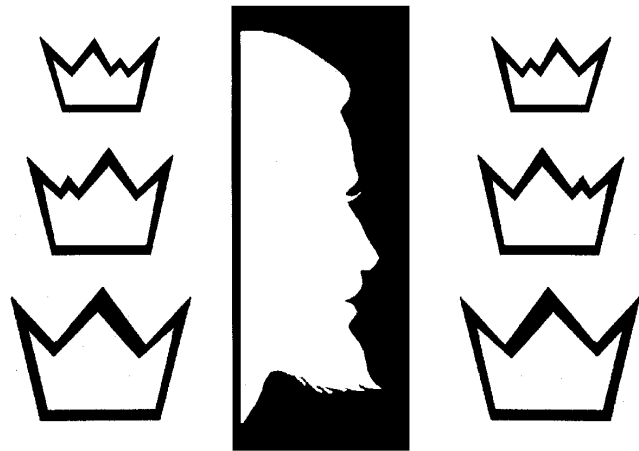
SACRAMENT OF THE SICK—Call the Church Office to request visitation of the sick.

JUSTICE & PEACE

Continuing from last week on Taking God Seriously. One of the things people most admire about Augustine was his love for God. By the time he was converted in 386, Augustine had avoided God for more than a decade. He admitted regretfully in his Confessions. "Twelve years had gone to waste, and I with them." For Augustine one big obstacle to discipleship was his unwillingness to follow Christ's teaching about sexual relationships. He used to pray " Grant me chastity and self control, but please not now." When he was ready God did not grant Augustine his wishes. God did not hold Augustine's delaying tactics against him. When Augustine got to the point of wanting God more than he wanted anything else, God was there to welcome him. Many people play the game with God for a lifetime. We need a sense of urgency about taking God seriously. No matter where we are in our relationship with Jesus , today is the day of salvation for us.

What does this all mean in terms of justice and peace? Many of us have been blessed abundantly by God. We have to thank God for this. We have to care for those less fortunate than we are. That is what justice and peace strives to do. Over 20 years St. Thomas More has contributed money and time to help the poor.

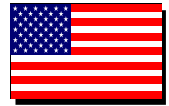
