#### A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

- 3. How do you balance the noise and activity of the season with the stillness and quiet that Advent offers?

Talk about the people in your life who are like John the Baptist in reminding you about what is really important in life. How do they help you to understand what God wants for you?

# FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends

We are in the second week of Advent. In today's second reading St. Paul summarizes the meaning of Advent. "My prayer is that your love for each other may increase more and more and never stop improving your knowledge and deepening your perception so that you can always recognize what is best." Advent invites us to intensify our love for each other and to recognize the best in us. What does this actually mean?

Energy, Enthusiasm and Empathy: In Advent we wait for the birth of Jesus, the birth of God in the human flesh. This means our human nature is considered by God as being of a worthy state of receiving God's birth; our human state is given God's worth. This worthy state given to us by God is the best, as St. Paul says, which we can recognize in our individual selves. Advent invites us to see that you and I are worthy of receiving God. You and I can become a bearer of God. Recognizing this

worth in each of us empowers us with Energy, Enthusiasm and Empathy.

Energy because our human nature is raised to the level of receiving God; thus each human being can become God's act. Human nature is not valued for its weakness but for its potency to receive God's grace.
