FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

The Epiphany of the Lord: Christmas says that God, the infinite mystery is born in the finite human category in a particular culture, time and space. The feast of the Epiphany proclaims that the human Baby Jesus is God who is neither bound by a particular culture or group of people, nor constrained by a particular period of time or place. God in Jesus reveals to all, belongs to all and includes all in God's gracious plan of Salvation.

The star that appears in the sky announces to all creation and every nation that God is born. The three wise persons from the East represent the people beyond the borders of the Jewish race and culture in which Jesus was born. They depict the divine truth that those who seek God will find God. The Lord reveals and only those who seek will recognize the revelation. The Lord is the light and we can see this reality only when we open our eyes. Epiphany is the light of the Lord. Let us open our eyes and recognize the Lord.

"20+G+M+B+13": Epiphany is the time to celebrate our home as the home which recognizes God and invites God's grace to fill the house. You may have noticed that over the inside entrance of the Church are written in chalk: "20+G+M+B+12"

which are the initials of the names of the three kings -- Gaspar, Melchior and Balthazar --surrounded by the year 2012. We will renew this Epiphany blessing for the current year 2013. You can bless your home in the same way by writing on the inside entrance the year and the names of the kings just as you find in the church. This signifies that God is revealing to us, the present day three kings, that God is not a God of old times, but of our time now, today of 2013.

The Epiphany blessing for homes: Make the Sign of the Cross on yourself.

Leader: God's peace be in this house and to all who live here. Magi came from the East to Bethlehem to adore the Lord; and opening their treasure chests they presented Him with precious gifts: gold for the great King, incense for the true God, and myrrh in symbol of his burial. Alleluia.

Pray the Lord's Prayer, the "Our Father ..."

Leader: Let us pray: O God, Who on this day revealed your only-begotten Son to all nations by the guidance of a star, grant that we who now know you by faith may finally behold you in your heavenly majesty, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Be enlightened and shine forth, O Jerusalem, for your light is come; and upon you is risen the glory of the Lord Jesus Christ, born of the Virgin Mary.

Let us pray: Lord, God almighty, bless this home, and under its shelter let there be health, charity, self-conquest, humility, goodness, mildness, obedience to your commands, and thanksgiving to God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. May your blessing remain always in this home and upon those who live here, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Sprinkle holy water throughout the home and then make the following inscription with colored chalk over the main entrance of your home:

20 + G + M + B + 13
