A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come". His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you". Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water". So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter". So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from— although the servers who had drawn the water knew —,the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now". Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.

Focus Questions:

1. Describe a time when you felt blessed beyond your expectations.
2. Describe a time when you were not prepared enough. Who came to your assistance?
3. Relate a time when you turned to Jesus in prayer and the answer you received was not what you thought.

Family and Children's Question:

Mary believes that her son, Jesus will give the family in the Gospel what they need. Talk about how important it is to turn to Jesus about the concerns you have in your life with the knowledge that Jesus will hear you.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

The Baptism of the Lord: This Sunday we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. The question often asked, is whether Jesus, the Son of God needs to be baptized. What happened when John the Baptist baptized Jesus? In the Gospel we hear that at the baptism of Jesus, the heavens opened and a voice was heard that Jesus is God's beloved Son. God openly revealed to the world that Jesus is God's Beloved Son sent to the world to do God's work of saving humans from sin and offering salvation.

In Jesus' case, His Baptism was the occasion of God's revelation of Who Jesus is. In our case when we receive Baptism, it washes away Original sin and declares us as children of God. Baptism frees us from sin and showers upon us the power to live as God's children. Thus the celebration of the Lord's Baptism reminds us who we are. What God declared of Jesus in His baptism is declared by God of us in our baptism. We become God's beloved children and in us God is well pleased. In celebrating Jesus' baptism we celebrate

ourselves, our own identity as God's children. The Baptism of the Lord, marks the end of the Christmas season officially and we return to ordinary time until Ash Wednesday. Therefore, this Sunday the manger, the Christmas Tree and the other Christmas decorations will be removed.

Thanks to all the helping hands: On Christmas day I left for India to celebrate my niece's final profession. I was not here for New Year's Day. In my absence, the priests, deacons, sacristans, volunteers, well wishers and you all took care of the parish and kept it going so well.

Thank you very much for all your help. Without your help I would not have been able to celebrate my first Christmas so meaningfully and joyfully here at St. Thomas More. I gratefully and prayerfully lift you and your families to the Lord that God may fill you with peace, prosperity, happiness and health throughout the New Year 2013.

Installation Ceremony: I began my ministry as pastor of our parish on October 11, 2012. The Code of Canon Law of the Catholic Church says ... "The local Ordinary (Bishop) or a priest delegated by him places the pastor in possession of the parish." It is interpreted in the following paragraph. "The diocesan Bishop could delegate vicar Forane or another representative to install a pastor in a paraliturgical or liturgical ceremony, which would include among other things the reading of the letter of appointment and the profession of faith.

Fr. Anthony Stanganelli, the Dean of Smithhaven Deanery, as official representative of Bishop William Murphy has kindly accepted to install me on Saturday, February 2, 2013, at 5:00 pm. I personally invite each and every one of you to attend this mass. It is an occasion for the family of St. Thomas More to gather as one flock to pray and praise the One Great Shepherd Jesus in whose pastoral mission we share in our own capacity, and I share as a Pastor. Come let us celebrate.

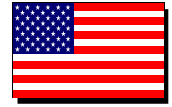
Our mission: to help people incorporate St. Thomas More Parish Outreach and the St. Thomas St. Vincent de Paul Conference.
