A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

Since many have undertaken to compile a narrative of the events that have been fulfilled among us, just as those who were eyewitnesses from the beginning and ministers of the word have handed them down to us, I too have decided, after investigating everything accurately anew, to write it down in an orderly sequence for you, most excellent Theophilus, so that you may realize the certainty of the teachings you have received.

Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news of him spread throughout the whole region. He taught in their synagogues and was praised by all.

He came to Nazareth, where he had grown up, and went according to his custom into the synagogue on the sabbath day. He stood up to read and was handed a scroll of the prophet Isaiah. He unrolled the scroll and found the passage where it was written:

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me,

because he has anointed me

to bring glad tidings to the poor.

He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives

and recovery of sight to the blind,

to let the oppressed go free,

and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord.

Rolling up the scroll, he handed it back to the attendant and sat down, and the eyes of all in the synagogue looked intently at him. He said to them, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

Focus Questions:

- 1. The ophilus means a lover of God. How are you showing yourself as a lover of God these days?
- 2. Describe a time when you brought good news to someone.
- 3. Relate a time when you felt moved by the Spirit to help someone in need.

Family and children's question

Talk about something you can do to share the Spirit of Love with people who do not have all the good things you do.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time: As we have started the New Year 2013, we finish Christmas time and enter into Ordinary time. The next four Sundays will be called Ordinary Time in the Liturgical Calendar followed by seven weeks of Lent leading up to Easter and Easter Time.

The Church calls this time Ordinary in the sense that at this time we do not celebrate any special or particular mysteries/ events in the life of Our Lord Jesus Christ (such as His birth, passion, death or resurrection) but other regular events and teachings of His public life. Thus this week the Gospel recalls the first sign/miracle that Jesus did in changing water into

Wine of Marriage: This Sunday's Gospel speaks of the miracle of Jesus changing water into wine at the marriage celebration in Cana in Galilee. Of the many significant meanings of this miracle, I invite you to see in it how every

human marriage can soon run out of its wine and then be left with only water.

As happened in the Gospel story, if the marriage partners have Mary and Jesus in their wedding union, Mary will intercede for them in their time of lacking wine. Their time of water will be changed into that of wine. We as humans are always insufficient both to our individual selves and to others. We need a higher presence and power to be with us in our union. Invite Mary and Jesus into your Marital Union and you will never run out of wine. Your insufficiency will be met with power and presence from above and the celebration of life will never be stopped. It will never run out of the celebrative wine. Even your ordinary time of water will be turned into the time of celebrative wine by the grace of Jesus at the intercession of Mary.

Decorations are down: As we have started the Ordinary time of the year, all the decorations of Christmas both inside and outside of the Church have been removed. The Church looks bare. A group of volunteers and the youth group were generous with their time to dismantle all the decorations, pack them in boxes and store them for next year's use. Thanks a million for their tireless work and enthusiastic help to take us from Christmas time to Ordinary Time.

Installation Ceremony: I began my ministry as pastor of our parish on 10.11.12. Cannon 527 of the Code of Cannon Law of the Catholic Church says ... "The local Ordinary (Bishop) or a priest delegated by him places the pastor in possession of the parish." It is interpreted in the following paragraph. "The diocesan Bishop could delegate vicar Forane or another representative to install a pastor in a paraliturgical or liturgical ceremony, which would include among other things the reading of the letter of appointment and the profession of faith. Fr. Anthony Stanganelli, the Dean of Smithhaven Deanery, as official representative of Our Bishop, Bishop William Murphy has kindly accepted to install me on Saturday February 2nd 2013, at 5:00 pm. I invite each and every one of you very personally to attend this mass. It is an occasion for the family of St. Thomas More to gather as one flock to pray and praise the One Great Shepherd Jesus in whose pastoral mission we all share in our own capacity and I as a Pastor. You alone have the words of eternal life. I will cling to your words, even when public opinion ridicules or rejects them.
