

Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything and followed him.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time: This week's Gospel is a continuation of last week's. It is the reaction of Jesus' native villagers to what He said about Himself as the fulfillment of Scripture. They could only see Jesus as one of their own, as the son of Mary and Joseph. They could not perceive in Jesus what He revealed to them. Jesus explains by examples how the human heart can become stubborn and hard and unable to open itself to the truth about others. Unless the heart opens and lets truth come in, nothing can illuminate a person. The second reading speaks about the key that will open every human heart. The key is LOVE.

Our Parish motto is 'Sharing the Spirit of Love'. We have the right key to human hearts. Let us open our hearts to let in God's truth and grace. Let us see the truth and walk in it with love.

Installation Weekend: On Saturday, February 2nd at the Mass at 5:00 pm I shall be installed by Fr. Tony Stanganelli. It is the day when the Diocese officially declares my appointment by the Bishop as Pastor and my willingness to serve in that capacity. At the same time the Parish acknowledges and expresses its readiness to help and serve along with me. Thus we, the Parish Family of St. Thomas More live as God's Kingdom and as a Community of Christ's disciples. During the Installation ceremony, representative of various ministries and volunteer groups will express this truth by presenting me with different symbols, such as Mass Vestments, Holy Oils, Sacramental Registers, Financial Ledgers etc.

Installation is a new beginning for you and for me. We renew to each other our willingness to search for God and to live as God's people. It is a new moment to revamp and to refresh 'Sharing the Spirit of Love'.

Flu Season- Holy Communion: In recent weeks, much attention has been paid to situations regarding the flu epidemic in our area. The Office of Worship offers the following suggestions: Holy Communion: The person who has a cold or is fearful of being infected is kindly advised to refrain from drinking the cup. All faithful are reminded that only one form is needed for full participation in Communion. Everyone accustomed to receiving Communion on the tongue should prevent spreading saliva to the hand of the Communion Minister by receiving Communion in the hand while sick.

Greeting of Peace: The faithful should use their own discretion and best judgment when invited to exchange the greeting of peace during the liturgy, limiting physical contact with oth-

ers. At the Sign of Peace, a simple bow of the head to those around should suffice.

Mass attendance: If a Catholic person is sick, there is no obligation to attend Mass. Personal prayer and reflection on the scriptures is encouraged as well as viewing Mass on television. We are all encouraged to use common sense in these matters; to do all that we can to maintain health, wellness and limit exposure to infection. Most importantly let's keep in our prayers those of our parish communities who are ill and are not able to participate at the liturgy with us.
