

Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

February 24, 2013 Second Sunday of Lent Genesis: 15:5-12, 17-18 Psalm 3:17-4:1 Philippians: 3: 17-4:1 Luke:9:28b-36

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus took Peter, John, and James and went up the mountain to pray. While he was praying his face changed in appearance and his clothing became dazzling white. And behold, two men were conversing with him, Moses and Elijah, who appeared in glory and spoke of his exodus that he was going to accomplish in Jerusalem. Peter and his companions had been overcome by sleep, but becoming fully awake, they saw his glory and the two men standing with him. As they were about to part from him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good that we are here; let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." But he did not know what he was saying. While he was still speaking, a cloud came and cast a shadow over them, and they became frightened when they entered the cloud. Then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my chosen Son; listen to him." After the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. They fell silent and did not at that time tell anyone what they had seen.

Focus Questions:

1. Describe a time when you felt transformed by a prayer experience.

2. Share an experience that you wanted to last longer. How was that like the apostles' experience?

3. Relate a time when you were not able to put into words some awesome experience you had. Looking back on that where do you see the hand of God?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

First Sunday in Lent: We have begun Lent by the imposition of ashes on our foreheads this past Wednesday. Wearing ashes is a symbol to remind us of the worth of the human body which will eventually be reduced to ash or dust after death. When we received ashes, the priest or minister said to us, "Repent and believe in the Gospel of Jesus Christ". These words invite us to see the value of the ash in the light of what happened to Jesus' body. Jesus died but rose again on the third day. The 40 days of Lent is the journey from Ash to Resurrection.

We have inbuilt Spiritual Power: We are not merely human bodies to end up in ashes but we carry within us the spiritual capacity/potency to rise again with Jesus. Lent is a call to remind us of our inner power to rise from the natural condition of our human body which will end up in ashes to the glory of resurrection by the grace of Christ's Resurrection. Lent is a Journey: Lent starts with Ash Wednesday with

wearing ashes but ends with Holy Week commemorating the

death and celebrating the Resurrection of Jesus in Easter. It is a big spiritual exercise inviting us to journey with Jesus towards the power of Resurrection.

Why fast and pray? During Lent we are encouraged to take a bit more time than usual to pray and to practice Fasting and Abstinence. Fasting is taking one full meal on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Abstinence is no meat on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays in Lent. Praying, fasting and abstaining from meat are spiritual acts to evoke in us the spiritual power that God has shared with us through the death and resurrection of Jesus. These spiritual acts build our spiritual strength and create in us a spiritual awakening. Let us take Lent seriously. Let us spend a little more time in prayer and try to observe the Lenten practice of Fasting and Abstinence.

Stations of the Cross: On Fridays during Lent at 7:00 pm we pray the 'Stations of the Cross' on various themes, and we invite you to this prayer. This will help you experience the mystery of our suffering in the light of the death and Resurrection of Jesus. On February 15th we prayed for children and the challenges faced in the present time. This week on February 22 we will pray for those who struggle with unemployment. Please come and pray for the unemployed and the underemployed.

Special Lenten Reflections, Vespers and Benedictions: I want you to especially remember three dates: Monday, February 25th, Tuesday March 5th, and Wednesday March 13th. On these three dates we will have Special Lenten Reflections with Vespers and Benediction. These reflections will help us to delve into different dimensions of our Spiritual Life. Please make an effort to attend as they will enrich your Spiritual Life. **Lenten Project:** In 2010, we had the opportunity to volunteer for the Christian Appalachian Project (CAP). . Our parish made donations of money, food, water, household and school supplies, which we were able to personally deliver. During our time there we volunteered in their Elderly and Housing programs. It was disturbing to see this level of poverty in our own country. The Appalachians are a very strong and proud culture. They were so thankful and appreciative. CAP reaches out and supports many people in many ways. CAP runs a housing program, an elderly program, child development centers, a domestic violence shelter, as well as a family advocacy program which provides children with school supplies and one new school outfit. Our monetary donation can go into a general fund to be used where needed, or marked for a specific program. Please help St. Thomas More this Lenten Season in supporting the Christian Appalachian Project. Please make checks out to St. Thomas More and we will send them one check for the amount collected. Catholic Ministries Appeal 2013: As a part of parish Stewardship, we begin our participation in this year's Catholic Ministries Appeal . We have a commitment to support both our own parish and the Diocese. In both aspects we help people. Your generosity to the Sunday collection enables St. Thomas More to meet its responsibilities in fulfilling the Mission of Evangelization and Spiritual Care of the parish family. Your contribution to the Catholic Ministries Appeal helps our Diocese fulfill its duties as they pertain to evangelization, education and pastoral care. Our Parish's assessment this year is \$ 65, 300. Some of you have already received a communication from the CMA Office asking for your continued help and support by making a pledge or contribution to the Appeal.
