## **FR. ANTONY'S LETTER**

Dear Friends,

**All you need to grow fine vigorous grass is a crack in your side walk.** The grass is not complaining about the hard, tough ground surrounding it. Grass does not waste even the smallest crack as an opportunity to express its life.

Today's Gospel starts with the disciples' depression. They felt let down following the death of Jesus. They were considering going back to fishing, their former trade. Jesus appears and cracks them open, and the possibility of life comes back. Their great catch of fish opens their eyes to the original call of Jesus, that 'they are not just fishermen but called to be fishers of men.'

Easter time invites us to see all those cracks in our life where God can make our life seep through.

## **JUSTICE & PEACE**

The Apostles requested Jesus, " Lord teach us how to pray." Our basic mistake is that prayer is something I do. There are many ways to pray, all of which focus on putting out much energy. We need to learn that all prayer is "charismatic prayer", for all prayer is the activity of the Holy Spirit and therefore a gift, charisma. Did we forget the teaching of Scripture that we do not have to earn God's love, for He already loves us? Prayer is not something we do, but the life of God expressing itself with us. Prayer is just daily exercise, one function in life, not even the most important function----it is life itself. It

is God alive in us, breathing in us, shaping us by His encounter, forming us in His goodness, His values and His hopes. What does this all mean in terms of justice and peace? What is it then we are to do? Prayer is not only a sacred place, a sacred relationship, and every relationship requires various skills and virtues. One is proper attitude. We need a humble attitude, a realization that this friendship with God offers us is a special gift to an undeserving servant. Our God is a humble God, a God who comes to wash our feet, to ease away our pride, our fears and our failures. We need a selfless heart, a childlike heart to embrace His nonjudgmental love. What does this all mean in terms of justice and peace? We need time to read and reflect on Scripture, to free ourselves from distractions, and to prepare for our encounter with the Lord. Pray and pray every day. Prayer is personal time with God; take the time to listen to God, then you will know what to do. With our new Pope Francis it seems that he wants us to give more to the poor. It will take time to convince more people who can, to give more.

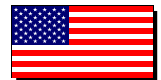
