

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

God is not in a Hurry: A friend of the great preacher Philip Brooks called on him and found him impatiently pacing the floor. His friend asked what the trouble was. Dr. Brooks exclaimed "The trouble is that I am in a hurry and God is not!"

Sixth Sunday of Easter: The first reading describes how the early church solved their first major problem of baptizing and including the Gentiles into the Christian community which consisted of only Jewish Christians. They assembled the first Jerusalem Council. Being led by the Holy Spirit they took the bold step of sharing the faith with the Gentiles too. From then and through the centuries Mother Church has lived through various problems and held numerous councils. Being led by the Holy Spirit, she has changed and emerged to face the challenges of the time. Like every epoch of the church, our own time has its own problems and challenges to be met. We are not yet a problem-free church. We may hurry to solve the problem in our own way but God is patiently leading us to perfection.

The second reading depicts the picture of the glorified Church as the New Jerusalem, perfect and spotless, in which Jesus the Lamb of God is fully present and alive. This is the ideal church towards which we are heading. This is our destination. Until then we will be striving towards perfection, not with quick human solutions but with God's patience.

The Gospel reading speaks about our striving spirit in

living the commandment of love. We may not solve all the problems of the church in our life time as we would wish. But we will lack nothing to joyfully run as a Church towards perfection if we live the commandment of Jesus, "Love one another as I have loved you". This is how the church will cherish the truth of today's Gospel, "If any one loves me he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we shall come to him and make our home with him.... The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name will teach you everything....." Pope Francis, from day one, invited us to "Let us journey together" - indeed, towards that New and Perfect Jerusalem, the glorified Church.

Congratulations to the First Holy Communicants and Confirmandi: For the last two weeks both at the Saturday 5:00 pm and Sunday 12:15 pm Masses over 120 children received their First Communion. Congratulations to them and to their parents who took an interest in their formation and brought them to the Eucharistic Table.

On Monday, April 22 Bishop Robert Brennan administered the Sacrament of Confirmation to 165 young men and women of our Parish. Appreciation and thanks go to their sponsors and families who helped them to grow as strong Christian witnesses to be equipped with the strength of Holy Spirit.

Many helped to make both these celebrations a heart moving spiritual experience for the candidates. Especially I gratefully remember the services of the Religious Education Directors, Pat Chapin and Mary Ellen Carroll. All the teachers who prepared the children deserve a special word of appreciation. A sincere word of thanks to the volunteers for rendering their service on the day of the actual celebration. The choir, under the direction of Emilia Savarese, did their best as always. Thanks all of you who make our parish family of St. Thomas More a celebrative Catholic community.

Parish Feast: This year the Parish feast of St. Thomas More falls on the weekend of June 22 and 23. We will celebrate with a dinner on Saturday,6/22 after the 5:00 pm Mass. After the Sunday Masses we will have a pancake breakfast. This is the occasion to acknowledge and appreciate the talents among us. 

JUSTICE & PEACE

Today we start a new series. Over the next several weeks we want to focus on hope in a world of darkness. There is much injustice and evil in the world today. As a resurrection people how do we change our attitudes and cultural biases? How do we deal with being victims, our attitudes towards each other, and are we generally in darkness? So many of us feel confused and powerless. We are overwhelmed by "isms" especially consumerism, racism, militarism, and individualism. Almost every day we read about corporate greed. Many of us feel helpless to choose a direction for ourselves or the community. How do we find some meaning in all of it? Many of us live in a constant state of anxiety and fear. We are producing very many unhappy and unhealthy people. We are beginning to realize that there are no absolutes in our society. There are no patterns to follow that are always true. Perhaps this is the answer to so much depression and suicide among our children. They see no hope out of darkness, but there is hope and there is light. It is Jesus who is our light. Saint Francis of Assisi had the answer in the 13th century and it is still valid today. He trusted the voice he heard and the truth from that voice. Francis focused on that center and moved out from there. What does this all mean in terms of justice and peace? As Christians we have to move from crime

and punishment to what Jesus preached - grace and mercybefore we can change and act. *To be continued*.
